AVY PENSION APPLICATIONS NOW ON MICROFICHE
- OTHERS TO FOLLOW

he National Archives is changing its method of eproduction for Civil War and later pension oplication files.

s of November 1, 1985, the first of several eries of Navy pension files from the Civil War and later will be available on microfiche.

The file of only one veteran has been reproduced on each microfiche. The name and any aliases that we may have used will appear at the top of each liche.

In response to requests received on NATF Form 80 for a pension file in a microfiched series, the National Archives will now send the entire microfiche file. The cost of each microfiche will be \$10.20. National Archives will no longer send paper copies of a portion of these files. If a paper copy of the file is desired, the requestor must pay \$10.20 for a copy of the whole file, which will be a copy of the microfiche.

The National Archives is recommending that researchers obtain the microfiche version of the pension files, and obtain access to a reader or reader printer in their local areas.

As additional series of Civil War and later pension files are copied to microfiche, they too will fall under these new availability restrictions,

It is the intention of the National Archives to eventually eliminate the availability of paper copies of these pension files, because of the expenses incurred with the present photocopying system.

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

The Genealogical Society of Rockland County has begun several long term projects, in keeping with the aims and goals of the Society. They are as ows:

-Committee to index "South of the Mountains" through December, 1985. This will be a name index only, compiled with the intent of future publication and sale. Chairperson-Ruth Morris

-Committee to compile a list of all available church records in print. After determining the dates of the latest published church baptismal, marriage and death records; all churches in the county will be surveyed to determine what additional genealogical records are open to the public. If possible, this information will be recorded and prepared for publication.

-Committee to survey the genealogical records at town and village Clerk's offices. A list will be made of records, dates available, areas covered, when available for public use, and how a copy may be obtained. Chairperson— Jo Pedersen Oldenburger

-Committee to record all printed genealogies and other source materials of genealogical interest to be found in local libraries.

anittee to coordinate the lists of genealogies and source materials found in local libraries and prepare a composite to be distributed to each library, the Historical Society of Rockland Co., and the Genealogical Society.

-Committee to catalog the existing files at the Historical Society of Rockland Co.

-Committee to survey local funeral homes to determine what genealogical information is available through their records, to record this information if possible, and prepare for publication.

BOOKS

The Slovaks of Haverstraw is a welcomed addition to the history of Rockland County. It is the first attempt to present a history of this little known but important group in the county. Basing his work on oral interviews as well as original records and documents, Dr. Sutherland presents a factual account of the Slovak community in Haverstram. their lives and the activities of the various Slovak societies that existed in the village at one time or another. A unique feature of the work is a comprehensive list of the Slovak pioneers in Haverstram. Their birthplace, date of birth, and arrival in Haverstraw are given when known. The book is recommended to anyone seeking information about the Slovaks in Rockland County or about Slovak life in America in general.

The author, Anthony X. Sutherland Ph.D. is a European historian specializing in Eastern Europe. In addition to the Slovaks of Haverstram, Dr. Sutherland has published: Jozef Tiso and Modern Slovakia (Cleveland: Jednota, 1978), The Fathers of the Slovak Nation (Rome: The Slovak Institute, 1981), The Canadian Slovak League: A History, 1932–1982 (Toronto: The Canadian Slovak League, 1982), as well as several articles.

The preceding review was supplied by the author. This book is in paperback form, and is available from the Historical Society of Rockland Co.
