



LETTERS FROM MEMBERS

FROM MRS. HELEN (ALBERT) NUESSELS, HATBORO, PA -




.. When I started my research, my son saic was getting "senile if I believed all my grandfather had told me". Well, I went to Stony Point to prove him wrong. With the help of Lucien Conklin, supervisor in Stony Point, I found my valley, my baptismal pool and my mine. (ed.',s note: Mrs. Nuessels' grandfather, George Alpheus Rose, had told her of these sites, used in the ministry of her great grandfather, Jacob Rose.) He (Lucien Conklin) had played in that valley and he knew the stories about my Jacob and Hannah. We met several other families who knew the reputation of "Shoutin' Jake" as he was known back then. I had heard he preached in the Methodist Creek Church but when I searched church records they did not have him listed even as guest preacher. It was not until shortly before his death that I met James Rose, a distant relative in his 90's, who told me that "Shoutin' Jake" did preach at the Creek Church, but it was an evangelical service in the evening when the church was not being used by the regular Methodist congregation. This type of information showing up at odd times has given me courage to believe that if the Good Lord gives me time, I will find everyone | am looking for ...

... I spent over 6 years trying to find my maternal grandmother's grave, she died in 1894 at the age of 34, so my mother who was eight years old barely remembered her. We did not start our research until mother had died, and we could not ask her questions. So I made three trips to Macopin New Jersey to see what I could learn, same old story, the church had lost its records during the Bi-Centenniel when someone took them to write up church history, several old people who "might" remember had just died, and several other setbacks. But I don't give up easily and finally located Mr. Hirsch, the Historian. who came up with my grandmother in his back yard!! He had purchased a large piece of land several years ago and found an abandoned cemetery and a small abandoned church in his back yard. So finally I had found Jennie Rhinesmith Rose, we went up (cont. on next page)

to the little overgrown cemetery to find that her stone (to me it looked like a miniature Washington Monument) overturned in the mud, weeds, and



other stones. My son, Mr. Hirsch and a neighbor of his, stood it up and this was final proof that "when the Lord wants me to know, I'll know" (that is a statement I frequently make that drives my son mad) because on the side of her tombstone were the names, birth and death dates of her parents...

I look forward to meeting you and attending a meeting of the Genealogical Society.

FROM MAUIS H. POLLOCK, TIFFIN, OHIO -

... am delighted to have the marriage record of Maria Oblenis and Charles Deady confirmed and date corrected from the not too clear record in the family Bible. The photocopy you sent me was from the combined records of the Tappan and Clarkstown Reformed Dutch churches but noted that you said the marriage was at the Tappan Church. From the baptismal records (thanks again) of Maria's siblings it seems that the Oblenis family was associated with the Clarkstown church. Was it the custom then to be married in the bridegroom's church? The notation that Charles Deady was "of Tappan" is a helpul bit of information as it is the first record of him I have so far found anywhere.

FROM MR. JAMES B. DANIELS, HOUSTON, TEXAS-

...! am very grateful for the extract from Cole's "History of Rockland County", because I'd heard of that book but had been unable to consult it...

I'm sending along to you some information concerning another of my lines, Hause and Wood, who lived in Rockland County ion the eighteenth century. Around 1800 William and Martha Hause and some of their children went west and settled in Steuben County. There is a history of the family of William Hause and Martha Wood, written by Mrs. Gregory around 1970. There is a copy of the family group sheet on the parents of William Hause that I prepared. Also a copy of a family group sheet on the same

persons, prepared by Mrs. Gregory. Re: the birth date of William Hause, she evidently had trouble distinguishing between a "3" and a "5". Not surprising in old script. There is a cover letter by Betty Ferguson, who located the group sheet done by Mrs. Gregory. The family of Martha Wood is described in two articles in "The American Genealogist: TAG" Vol. 39 (1963): Bertha Clark, "Rhode Island Woods on Long Island." "TAG" Vol. 49 (1973): Matthew Wood, "Joseph Wood, Blacksmith, of Hempstead and Kakiat, New York."

MEETING OF DECEMBER 17, 1985. GUEST SPEAKER WAS MRS. JOYCE ALTIERI, DEPUTY COUNTY CLERK OF ROCKLAND COUNTY

At this meeting, Mrs. Altieri spoke about the types of records available for the public at the County Clerk's Office. Below is a reprint of the handout prepared by the Clerk's Office.

As a follow-up of this meeting, on OCTOBER 27, 1987, A MEETING WAS HELD AT THE COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE. Mrs. Altieri again gave a brief review of all the records available. In particular, she pointed out the locations of the indexes to the deeds, explained how to use them, and where to find the mortgagor and mortgagee books.

Deed records are available from 1798 in handwritten volumes. There are also three books of Orange County deeds (before Rockland became a county dating from 1703. Future deeds will be available for viewing at the office and on computer printouts. Mrs. Altieri explained the computer system and how to search for deeds and get a printout. At the end of each day, backup copies of the new deeds are made to prevent loss of information in case of power failure. A complete set of all records are in safe storage in upstate New York.

New York State Census records are available in handwritten book form for the years and townships:

1855 - Ramapo and Haverstraw 1860 - Clarkstown and Orangetown 1865, 1878, 188, 1892, 1905, 1915, 1925 for Clarkstown, Haverstraw, Orangetown, Ramapo, and Stony Point

After the presentation, the members were invited to search in the records for as long as they wished, over one hour, and were very pleased with the results of their searches.

The Clerk's Office does not have anyone available to do research. The Society would like to make this services available, but no one has volunteered to tackle the job. If you find you now have free time during the office hours, and would like to search records for members, please contact your genealogy researchers, Pat. Kerner, Leslie Baisley, or Marie Koestler.




