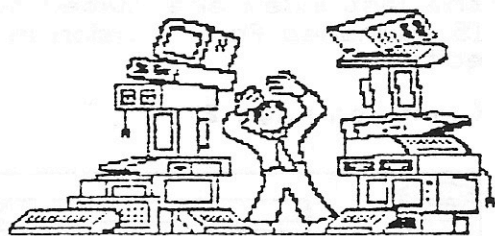

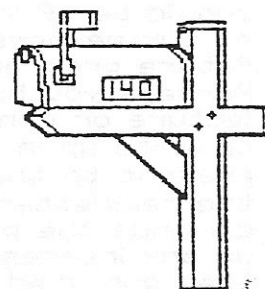

Joseph W. Casscles, born 1839, was the son of James and Mary (Cash) Casscles. Emeline Ten Eyck, born 1845, was the daughter of Jacob Ten Eyck and Eliza Allison. All of these families live in Rockland County. Joseph and Emeline Casscles, my great-grandparents, lived in Stony Point and Stony Point Township (Tomkins Cove). I have much additional information on all the families that I would be glad to share.

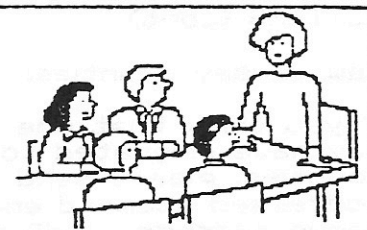

MEETING OF NOVEMBER 26, 1987, WAS HELD AT
THE SURROGATE'S COURT CLERK'S OFFICE AT
THE ROCKLAND COUNTY COURTHOUSE ...

The clerk, Virginia Athens, and the Deputy
Clerk, informed the membership of the
types and dates of the records available
and how to use the indexes. After the
session, members were permitted to do
research for about 45 minutes.

The 1798 to 1957 indexes are in book form
and are located on the shelves. The 1957
to 1985 index is an alphabetical surname
index behind the counter. 1986 to current
year indexes are available on a computer
printout at the counter.

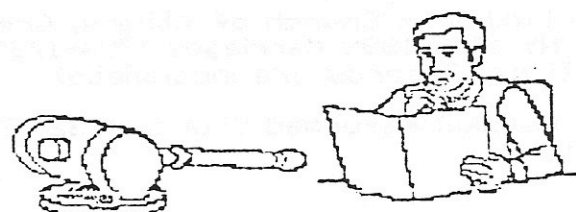
TO SEARCH for a probated will, one would
go to the book, card index, or computer
printout for the year in question. When
liber and page number are located, then
one goes to the appropriate liber and
page of the Will Book to read the will. A
photocopy machine is available for use by
the researcher.

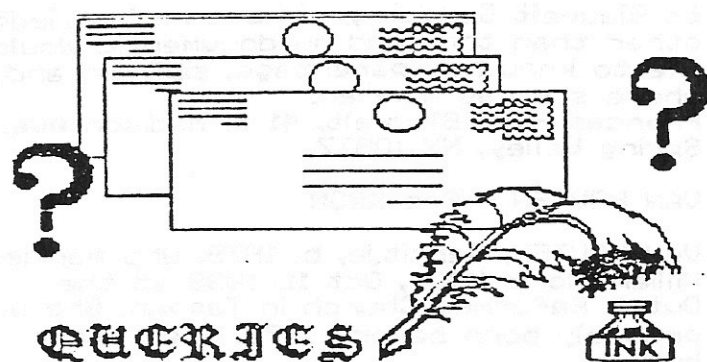
It was noted that not all wills were
probated, which explains why you may not
find a will. If there was a dispute over th
will, then it would have been probated to
determine its (the will's) legality.

If you do find a will, ask to see the File
Folder, which would contain all other
papers pertaining to the probate record.

Once you have the liber and the page
number of the will, a photocopy would cos
\$.25 a page. If you request a 25-year
search by the Surrogate's Office for a
will, the fee would be \$53.00. A certified
copy of the will would be \$4.00 a page.

The clerks were very helpful at the
meeting, and members who have since gone
to the Surrogate's Office have received
the same helpful assistance.

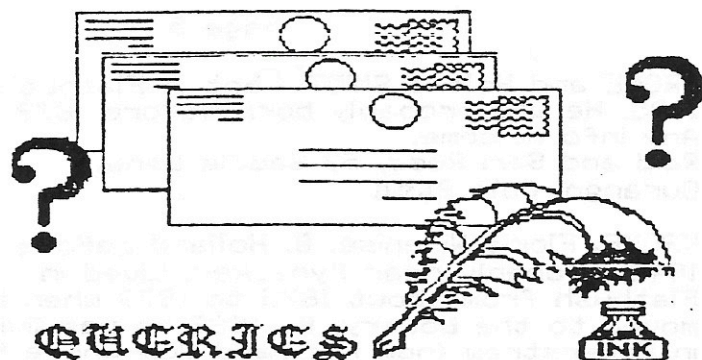
REED - See JOHNSON

He joined the New Hempstead Presbyterian Church in 1785. His will was probated in New Hempstead 10, 1811. Seek any other info, and names of family researchers.

REED, Daniel, b. Aug 5 & bapt Oct 31, 1779, probably the youngest child of Peter REE and Maria KROM. He was a carpenter and was probably killed (or died) in the War of 1812. Death date was Nov. 12, 1812. Any info.

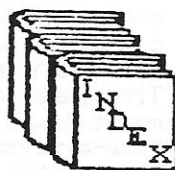

BOOK REVIEW

"IMMIGRANT LIFE IN NEW YORK CITY, 1825-1863", by Robert Ernst, Octagon Books, Division of Farrar, Straus, and Giroux, New York, 1979, LC No. F128.9.A1E7 1979

For anyone researching an immigrant ancestor who may have lived in New York City during the period of time focused on by the author, this book is an absolute must. Whether your ancestor was Irish, German, English, Scotch, Italian, French, it does not matter. He covers all the immigrants of the period in considerable detail. He draws heavily on census statistics, especially the 1855 New York State census, as well as documents, reports, and ethnic newspapers of the day. From his sources he weaves a comprehensive picture of each of the primary nationalities who populated the Empire City during the period.

The material of this work was originally presented as the author's thesis at Columbia University in 1949. The book was first published by King's Crown Press in New York and reprinted in 1979. The book contains 184 pages of highly informative text divided into fifteen major chapters. Some of the titles: The Lure of America, The Immigrant Arrives, The Immigrant Settles, Tenement Life, Gaining a Foothold in Industry, Immigrant and Native Workers, the Foreign Vote. The author presents his facts in a highly readable

manner that, for this writer, allowed me to transport myself to the "sidewalks of New York" and hear the Babel of tongues and accents that existed in that era. Despite its easy readability, the book is truly a classical scholarly work. The author provides 70 pages of notes mercifully consolidated in one section, plus 22 pages of bibliography. The latter may be of minimal value since the book itself is 38 years old. However its age is a plus to my way of thinking since it is 38 years closer to when its subjects were actually alive! ...

Being a "bibliography junkie" and a haunt of library information desks, my spouse came upon a reference to this work in her quest to discover her Irish ancestors who entered the United States in 1836. She ordered the book through the inter-library loan system at our local library. The book was found at the University of Maryland library. She was delighted with the book as it will provide the background information that tends to explain why certain ancestors did certain things, why they held the jobs they did, why many of them died so early in life and a myriad of other aspects of their lives which she could never hope to document directly. It was poetic, Ernst's book provides a canvas on which the genealogist can apply the paints of birth, death and marriage specific to his ancestral line. Definitely worthwhile to obtain and read, even just for the fun of it.

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NY TIMES ...

When researching individuals who lived and died in the vicinity of New York City, you may be able to locate a death date by looking in the Index to Obituaries of the NY Times, a standard reference work found in most libraries. However, unless the person was newsworthy, a regular obituary with biographical background will seldom be found. The alternative, though, is the use of Death Notices. These are the entries arranged like classified ads, in smaller than normal print, usually under a heading like "DIED" on the same page, normally, as the obituaries. Unfortunately, the death notices are not indexed. Therefore you need a date of death or a fair approximation to it in order to reasonably limit your search time. There is much information to be gleaned from the death notices. We recently spent a few hours at a large city library, where they have the complete NY Times, and looked up about a dozen death notices for which we already had death certificates. Was this documentation overkill? Not at all when you consider that we got two confirmations of birth order, two addresses we needed, the name of a company we didn't know, the names of two churches people attended, the confirmation of the relationship of two men as brothers and the identification of a hitherto unknown third brother.

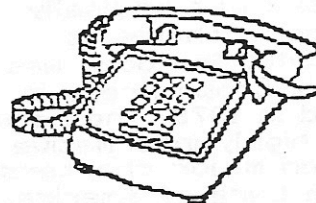
Also, the array of death notices, when suitably transcribed and arranged in chronological order painted a picture of one man and his influence within the family. The patriarch of the clan was always mentioned in the notices. It was always "so-and-so's daughter, granddaughter of the patriarch". Although the death notices take more work to locate than nicely indexed obituaries, it's worth the effort for what you're likely to find.

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
