

AVAILABILITY OF VITAL RECORDS THREATENED ??

FROM A LETTER FROM DORIS DOUGLAS, CAPISTRANO BEACH, CA. FROM "THE SEARCHER" NOV., 1988

Ohio vital statistics may not be available to researchers unless we take immediate action. An amended House Bill No. 790 which has a section on vital records (Section 3705.23) gives the local registrar at the County Health Department the right to permit or NOT to permit the inspection of vital records. Access would be limited to persons who have a "direct and tangible interest" in the record. The bill designates those having such an interest. Genealogists ARE NOT included the list.

The bill, having passed the Ohio House, is currently with the Senate Health and Human Services Committee. You are urged to write a letter to the committee. Let them know how important these vital records are to everyone, not just g**en**ealogists and historians, particularly the knowledge of recurring health problems as shown on death certificates.

The section also outlines the data to be included on a birth records, i.e. name, sex, date of birth, registration date, and place of birth. NO PARENTS' NAMES OR INFORMATION WILL BE INCLUDED. No longer will this most acceptable and reliable source of primary evidence be available.

Provided one may submit staisfactory cause to be permitted to have a certificate, there is no proviso which indicates what the Director demands for his 'approval' for an uncertified copy of a certificate. An additional fee?


OHIO VITAL RECORDS (CONT.)



Abraham POST married a Charity about 1802 or 1803 and I have an indication she was a DEGRAW/DEGRAY. Their first son Abraham was born 1803 and second son John born in 1807. I had thought that perhaps father would be John, because of the name of the second son. According to Robert's NY in the Revolution (p.158) there were four persons (Cornelius, John, Luke William) who served in the Orange Co. militia. I have checked Cole's History of Rockland County but no help there.
