February 20, 1991 issue of *Our Town* (Pearl River, NY) described the Court of Honor at which Michael Liao Lee received scouting's highest rank, the Eagle award. Requirements for the Eagle award include winning 25 merit badges and planning and executing a community service project. Lee chose to organize a clean-up of the historic Old Tappan cemetery, which had fallen into disrepair after years of neglect. With a crew of Troop 132 scouts and other volunteers, Lee removed years of accumulation of debris from the old cemetery and with the assistance of the Old Tappan Department of Public Works, spread gravel on cemetery roads and pathways to stop erosion.

✓ **New York State Council of Genealogical Societies Organized**—A steering committee composed of individuals from seven societies and institutions concerned with New York State genealogy, headed by Jack T. Ericson of the State University of New York at Fredonia, has proposed a constitution for the new Council. Delegates from each state genealogical society were invited to meet on April 13 and 14 in Johnstown and Fonda to discuss and vote on the proposed constitution and to elect officials.

✓ **"The Patents and Manors of New York State"** was the topic of speaker Marjorie Renino at the February Westchester Genealogical Society meeting. The talk was summarized in the society's March newsletter. Ms. Renino discussed the background and history of New York's Manors and Patents and offered some sources and techniques for researching them.

The NYG&B Library has also purchased from the Municipal Archives the 1890 New York City "Police" Census, so called because its enumerators were police officers. The census covers what was then New York City (Manhattan) and the western half of the Bronx. This census is important to genealogists because the 1890 Federal Census was destroyed by fire. To access this police census, it is necessary first to find an address from a city directory or other contemporary document.

The NYG&B Society is located at 122 East 58th Street, New York City (212-755-8532). Library hours are Mon-Sat 9:30 -5:00; closed for month of August, legal holidays and Saturdays in June, July and September. Non-members have access to the book collection, but not to manuscripts or microforms.
