✓ Rockland History Month at New City Library — "Happy Valley School — A History and Remembrance," a work by local author Tom C. Riley, will be discussed on Thursday, October 5 at 8 p.m. at New City Library, 220 North Main Street, New City, NY 10956. The talk is part of the library's celebration of Rockland History Month. Riley's book recounts the development of Happy Valley School, an outgrowth of the work of The Five Points House of Industry, a private charitable foundation organized in 1850 to relieve the harsh conditions faced by children in the distressed area of New York City known as "Five Points District." In the early 1900s, a site in Pomona was donated by the William Church Osborn family so that these children could be exposed to a more wholesome environment and to escape the epidemic of diphtheria that was plaguing the area. A New City resident and Nanuet Post Office employee, Riley is also a writer-photographer who has written numerous articles and materials as well as a book on the early history of postal services.

On Sunday, October 15, at 2 p.m. at the New City Library, Dorothy and Thomas Hoobler will discuss "The Chinese American Journey." The Hooblers, New York City residents, have published more than 50 books for children and young adults. They will discuss their book, The Chinese American Family Album, and how they tracked materials for their work.

(NJ) Historical Society, a stop order has been placed on the destruction of Railroad Pension Papers at the National Archives. The pension records contain the claimant's address, race, sex, date and place of birth, father's full name, mother's maiden name, the employment and retirement history, including claims made by the widow or widower with proof of the marriage and death of the retiree. This stop order and other agreements were made at a meeting between NARA staff members and a contingent from the genealogical community at the Federation of Genealogical Societies. Irish Genealogy

Program presented by Donal Mac Namara (a columnist for the "Irish Families") at the May 23, 1995 meeting of the Genealogical Society of Rockland County. Notes by Marie Koestler.

Mr. MacNamara extended greetings from the Orange County Genealogical Society and invited members and non-members to visit the Society and use their research room facilities.

A number of newspaper clippings were quoted on various aspects of interest to genealogists, for example: *The New York Times* noted that the Alston Family, White and Black, were having a get-together. This was by way of explaining that genealogy is a search on all aspects of a person's background, genes, friends, and relatives.

Mr. MacNamara is writing a history entitled "The notables and the Notorious" about his own Irish family background. He stated that often it is more interesting to research the "notorious" rather than the "famous."

A fault common to many researchers is that they only search the direct male line, ignoring the female line as well as other members of the family. Today there are children who do not even know their mother's maiden name, the proper names of their grandparents, or where they came from. All family members: aunts, uncles, cousins, etc. are important and contribute to what you are and who you are. Give your children an inheritance of their family backgrounds, the particulars of their mother and father, grandparents, as well as pictures and anecdotes to make the ancestors come alive.

Ireland exports more than they import — notably their sons and daughters. Many of these sons and daughters became noted persons in government, artistic fields, and other fields throughout the world, not only in the United States. There are 40-50 million Irish descendants in America alone.

Ireland is a mixture of nationalities; in the 6th and 5th centuries BC there were the Celts. Then came the Scandinavians, Danes, Europeans. In the 12th century the Normans of England invaded and conquered the country because their weapons and skills were greater than the capabilities of the Irish, who were basically an agricultural people. There were French and Swiss Huguenots, Germans in the 19th century, the Spanish and Italians. The Scots also came, but they are of Celtic background.

Before starting on Irish genealogy, one needs to understand the history of Ireland, get familiar with Ireland itself — the geography, the local jurisdictions of the country, the character of the people. There were four provinces: Connaught, Leinster, Munster, and Ulster. Northern Ireland encompasses all of Ulster except three counties: Cavan, Donegal, and Monaghan which belong to the Republic of Ireland. There are 32 counties (political, administrative districts). The church of Ireland and the Roman Catholic Church have different diocesan systems. The people were clannish

and tended to remain close to their own county — their homeland. This is the reason it is important to first determine which county the family came from, then find the proper ecclesiastical parish. About 90/95 percent of Ireland is Roman Catholic. There are no public records until about 1864, and only a smattering of Protestant church records. Until the Catholic emancipation came about in 1829, people were afraid to admit they were Roman Catholic for fear of persecution.

Many Americans are descendants of Irish immigrants of the 1850s — there are very few records of these immigrants, with the exception of records for important people. Probate records are helpful; when people died and left their farm to others, they had to have a will even though the property was small (most were 20-25 acres). Check the Mormon files at the Family History Centers — they have collected many probate records which contain a great deal of family information.

Mr. MacNamara is interested in clan history. This history provides names of a large group of people with common names like Kelly, Murphy; smaller clans have a closer affinity. All clans had Gallic names. In the 12th century surnames came into fashion for the chiefs, for others a surname came later in time. Almost all clans are traceable to a common ancestor but there is a great transliteration of names which makes it difficult to find that ancestor. During immigration names were changed, most of the immigrants were illiterate; when they came to a port the clerks spelled the names phonetically; the ship's clerk may again spell it differently, and upon arrival, it would probably be spelled differently again. Many Irish surnames today bear little resemblance to what they were originally. The same is true of Christian names. Clans had a small number of names from which to choose and there are many variations of each name.

In the case of Mac and Mc, in the 17th or early 18th century Mac was used; sometime in this century people started using Mc. Diminutives are popular and sometimes they become a person's name, usage depends upon the country in which the name is prominent.

It is important to trace your American ancestry before planning overseas research. The Family History Centers of the Mormon Church are excellent places to begin your overseas search. They have a very fine pamphlet "Research Outline — Ireland" (there are pamphlets for other countries also) that can be ordered. They are available at your local FHC, or write to Family History Department, 50 East North Temple Street, Salt Lake City, UT 84150. (Cost is not available at this time). This is a very complete work which gives types of records available or not available. It is a valuable tool. There is available a "householders index" which helps to locate people in little known records. The Mormons have also compiled a "dead file" (listing of deaths) that would also be useful.

Waves of immigrants usually came following disasters such as revolutions in the country, famine, economic difficulties. A study of the history of the country and people will be most helpful in your search for your Irish ancestors. ■

ANCESTOR TABLES ■

In order to increase interaction between members, the Society has begun to publish Ancestor Tables, which are a brief listing of the ancestry of members. These tables will be printed in expanded editions of the newsletter for a year, after which the Board will evaluate the response and decide whether to continue publishing these tables. It is hoped that members will find distant cousins who share common lines, which will further the research efforts of both.

Other members are encouraged to submit their Ancestor Tables to Bob Protzmann, 4 Ethel Drive, New City, NY 10956, who will assist the editor in their preparation for

publication.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. We will publish these in a continuing dialogue, in the Ancestor Table Forum.

SUGGESTIONS FOR FORMATTING SUBMISSIONS OF ANCESTOR TABLES

All submissions of ancestor tables are welcome in whatever format; we will, as time permits, retype them to fit our format.

If, however, you are putting your ancestor table together especially for us, here are some thoughts that might be helpful. Ancestor tables are presentations of genealogical data in a linear, text-oriented, non-graphic format. Think of them as fan charts or family tree charts stripped of their graphic format; just the text, or words, remain, presented in a linear fashion.

The following suggestions have been formulated in the interest of clarity and to prevent misunderstood information.

A sample entry might look like this:

 John KING, b. 10 Jan 1867 Haverstraw, NY; d. 3 Aug 1943 Suffern, NY; m. 10 Jan 1890 Spring Valley, NY,

A more complicated entry might look like this:

22. John IRVING, b. 12 Feb 1682 Tappan, NY; d. 3 Oct 1744 Haverstraw, NY. He was one of the first Rockland Co. settlers and was a justice at Tappan. He m. (1) 1701 NYC Amanda Bright. He m. (2) 10 Jan 1704 Hackensack, NJ,

23. Isabel JONES, b. 14 July 1683 Bergen, NJ; d. 23 Mar 1752 Tappan, NY. She had m. (1) 14 Nov 1702 Hackensack, NJ, Robert Doe. She m. (3) 1746 Albert

DeBaun.

Begin the entry with the name of the individual, with the surname in all capital letters. For surnames such as DeBaun or dePew which are found, depending on individual family preference, written in a variety of ways (DeBaun, deBaun, Debaun, and DePew, dePew, Depew, etc.) indicate the correct spelling by writing the name in both upper and lower case letters (for instance, DeBAUN, deBAUN, DEBAUN). Any other surnames listed in the entry (for instance, additional spouses not in one's direct line) should not be capitalized. Only the mother and/or father in line in the ancestry should have capitalized surnames.

Use a comma after the first listing of the individual's name. Use semicolons between events, except after the final event in the sequence, when a period should be used. When the final entry lists the marriage to the next listed individual, the marriage event data should be followed by a comma.

Our preferred format for dates is day, month, year, with a space between them. Abbreviate months by using the first three letters. When indicating the place where an event took place, use the format shown in the above examples, with no comma after date.

Notice the format used in the more detailed sample (above) when there are multiple marriages for either or both the husband and wife. If there is biographical data about an individual, place the marriage in a separate sentence at the end of the entry, so that the husband's entry flows right into the next listed individual, when that next listed individual is, indeed, his wife. A careful reading of examples #22 and #23 above will tell you that the line contains the husband's second of two marriages, and the wife's second of three marriages.

All of this sounds complicated, but following these suggestions will, it is hoped, avoid misunderstood

information.

Any other suggestions? We welcome any ideas that will add to the clarity of presenting genealogical data in the format of ancestry tables.

Editor's Note: In our May issue, The Ancestry of Ralph Blauvelt was accidentally truncated, so the missing final portion is included in this issue. (Live and learn: when formatting the text for Mr. Blauvelt's ancestor table, a blank page was somehow inserted into the middle of the running pages of text. Later, when I was putting the newsletter together, I came to the blank page and thought it was the end of the table. To prevent this from occurring in the future, I am now formatting a symbol at the end of each table, a change you will see reflected in this newsletter!
