#### NOTICES

✓ New York Archives Search Service -The New York State Archives has instituted a new vital records index search service. Genealogists and other researchers may now request a search of the State Department of Health microfiche indices to vital records. The indices cover the entire state, except for New York City, and for Albany, Buffalo and Yonkers prior to 1914. They span the years 1880/81-1943 for marriages and deaths, and 1881-1918 for births. The indices contain summary data and refer researchers to the full certificates held by the Department of Health (note that the original registers are in the custody of local registrars of vital statistics). Researchers may request the New York State Archives to search one vital record for one name for up to three specific years; the request must be made on a Vital Records Index Search Request Form and each request must be accompanied by the \$5. fee (check or money order payable in US funds). Applicants must sign a statement that the individual named in the request is now deceased. Request forms are available from the New York State Archives, Cultural Education Center 11D40, Albany, NY 12230.

✓ Westchester County Surname List — The 1995 Westchester County Genealogical Society Surname List (a bi-annual publication) is now available. The list is compiled of 4,955 different surnames currently being researched by 194 active members (as of 20 Aug 1995) who have submitted 6,219 surnames. ✓ Bergen County Place Names —
Publication plans are in preparation for an upcoming book on Bergen County (NJ) Place Names, compiled by Pat Wardell. The book will include place names used over the years for areas and locales in Bergen County as well as counties formerly part of Bergen County (for instance, Passaic County, Hudson County, etc.) and neighboring areas and counties including Rockland County, NY. A 1996 publication date is anticipated.

#### ✓ Registers of St. John's Church —

"Abstracts of the Parish Register of St. John's Church, Greenwood" is a new publication by Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot. The original stone church is located on the Harriman estate in Arden, New York. This 72-page abstract includes communicants, confirmations, marriages, burials, contributors — and 901 baptisms from 1856 to 1923. Sponsored by the Parrott brothers, the church was an important part of life at Greenwood Iron Works until 1885 when Clove Furnace and surrounding mines closed. Many of the families moved to Rockland or have Rockland relatives. Available from (Continued on page 2)

✓ LDS Family History Centers — There are more than 1,000 LDS branch libraries, or Family History Centers in the United States. Each is located at an LDS church, they are staffed by volunteers, and they are open to the public. One nearby Family History Center is on Soldier Hill Road in Emerson, Bergen County, NJ. It is open on Tuesdays from 1-9 pm; Wednesdays from 9 am to 3 pm and 7 to 9 pm; Thursdays from 9 am to noon and 6:30 to 9 pm; Fridays from 9 am to 4 pm; and Saturdays from 9 am to noon.

New Jersey Birth & Death Indexes — According to *The Castle Genie*, the newsletter of the Genealogy Club of the Passaic County (NJ) Historical Society (Fall 1995), the LDS Library in Morristown, NJ has New Jersey Birth & Death Indexes for 1848 to 1878, which are on permanent loan there. These are indexes only — they list only child's first initial, father's first initial, year born, and the vol # and page #. For the actual record, write or visit the New Jersey State Archives in Trenton.

✓ Buyer Beware — GSRC member Marie Koestler warns members about purchasing

"genealogies" like the one she received a mailing for —
"Three Centuries of Koestlers." The mailing (in this
case a postcard) promises marriage records, census
records, military records, a resident records, and
exclaims: "You're in it!" These unsolicited "genealogies"
are far from the complete genealogy you might expect,
and instead have limited historical references from
usually secondary, printed sources, and a listing of
people with the surname living in the USA and
sometimes around the world. These names are usually
compiled using telephone directories as a source. You
yourself can access telephone directories in print and
on CD-ROM at any major library to make your own list
of persons with the surname of interest.

If you buy a product represented as being about your family, but whose distinguishing feature is a list of people with your surname, you can return it for a refund. If you have not received a refund with six weeks, complain to the Consumer Protection Division, US Postal Service, 475 L'Enfant Plaza SW, Washington,

DC 20260-2100.

✓ Bank Books Tell Story of Irish

Refugees — According to an item on the editorial page of the New York Times Thursday, 21 Sep 1995, a newly uncovered treasure trove of data in the Emigrant Industrial Savings Bank's basement was discovered last year when an archivist, Marion Casey, asked to look at the 11 books containing details on depositors, mostly from the Irish community, plus 40 other volumes of mortgages and minutes of meetings. The bank was founded in 1850 at the instigation of Archbishop John Hughes to help the flood of famine victims pouring into New York City by giving them a place to keep their money safe and a way to send money home to destitute relatives. When the Emigrant Industrial Savings Bank in lower Manhattan opened for business on the night of September 30, 1850, one of those who opened an account was Patrick Egan, an Irish laborer from County Galway. Upon opening his account, Egan gave the information that he was single, a laborer in the Marine Quarantine Hospital on Staten Island, a native of Cormack in County Galway, and came to New York aboard the Howard on May 28, 1841. His parents, Owen and Mary Quinn, were dead. His sister Margaret lived in New York and their sister Bridget remained in Ireland. The books have been donated to the New York Public Library's manuscript collection and should be available for public use in a few months.

If you buy books at flea markets, garage sales, etc. or retrieve them from an old attic or basement, cook them upon bringing them into your home.

Microwaving for 60 seconds on "warm" will kill insects and their eggs (Be sure to remove any metal or staples before microwaving!) Don't laugh — the Library of Congress does this — they often come across lice, silverfish and cockroaches.

#### Decoding the Social Security Number

(from the May 1995 issue of the *Queens (NY)*Genealogy Workshop Newsletter)

The first three digits of a person's Social Security Number indicate the state that the person was living in at the time the number was assigned. The exceptions to this rule are numbers in the 700-729 range, which were issued by the Railroad Retirement Agency.

The fourth and fifth digits indicate the group number. The sequence is reported to be odd numbers from 01-09, then even numbers from 10-98, then even numbers 02-08, and finally odd numbers 11-99. All numbers issued before 1965 are either odd numbers between 01 and 09, or even numbers between 10 and 98. The last four digits are the "serial number," and run from 0001 to 9999....

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. We will publish these in a continuing dialogue, in the Ancestor Table Forum.

## SUGGESTIONS FOR FORMATTING SUBMISSIONS OF ANCESTOR TABLES

All submissions of ancestor tables are welcome in whatever format; we will, as time permits, retype them to fit our format.

If, however, you are putting your ancestor table together especially for us, here are some thoughts that might be helpful. Ancestor tables are presentations of genealogical data in a linear, text-oriented, non-graphic format. Think of them as fan charts or family tree charts stripped of their graphic format; just the text, or words, remain, presented in a linear fashion.

The following suggestions have been formulated in the interest of clarity and to prevent misunderstood information.

A sample entry might look like this:

DeBaun.

Begin the entry with the name of the individual, with the surname in all capital letters. For surnames such as DeBaun or dePew which are found, depending on individual family preference, written in a variety of ways (DeBaun, deBaun, Debaun, and DePew, dePew, Depew, etc.) indicate the correct spelling by writing the name in both upper and lower case letters (for instance, DeBAUN, deBAUN, DEBAUN). Any other surnames listed in the entry (for instance, additional spouses not in one's direct line) should not be capitalized. Only the mother and/or father in line in the ancestry should have capitalized surnames.

Use a comma after the first listing of the individual's name. Use semicolons between events, except after the final event in the sequence, when a period should be used. When the final entry lists the marriage to the next listed individual, the marriage event data should be followed by a comma.

Our preferred format for dates is day, month, year, with a space between them. Abbreviate months by using the first three letters. When indicating the place where an event took place, use the format shown in the above examples, with no

comma after date.

Notice the format used in the more detailed sample (above) when there are multiple marriages for either or both the husband and wife. If there is biographical data about an individual, place the marriage in a separate sentence at the end of the entry, so that the husband's entry flows right into the next listed individual, when that next listed individual is, indeed, his wife. A careful reading of examples #22 and #23 above will tell you that the line contains the husband's second of two marriages, and the wife's second of three marriages.

All of this sounds complicated, but following these suggestions will, it is hoped, avoid misunderstood

information.

Any other suggestions? We welcome any ideas that will add to the clarity of presenting genealogical data in the format of ancestry tables.


