✓ **"Descendants of Baileytown"** — The vanished hamlet of Baileytown in the Ramapo Mountains overlooking Woodbury Common, Orange County, NY is recalled in a new book by Marjorie Smeltzer Stevenot of Sloatsburg. Its homes were razed in this century to enlarge Harriman State Park.

"Descendants of Baileytown" is a history and genealogy of the Bailey family beginning with Jeremiah Bailey, a charcoal burner, who was born near Slaughter Lake in 1783. It follows his son Jacob's 14 children and

their related families — including Montanye, Ward, Swim, Crill and others — to the sixth generation. The book is one of a series of genealogies of Ramapo Mountain families which Mrs. Stevenot is planning to publish. (1) New York State Archives in the NY State Museum Building, Madison Avenue, Albany, NY. on the 11th floor, 9-5 on Monday through Friday (except Wednesday mornings, open from 1 pm to 5 pm on Wed.). Free access to use the indexes. Five seats. No photocopying the index, note taking only.

(2) New York State Dept. of Health Vital Records

office, on Concourse Level under the NY State Office Plaza, across the street from the State Museum. Hours 9-4, Monday through Friday. Two seats. No photocopying the index, note taking only.

The New York State Library and Archives site on 11th floor in Albany, as of Wed., Sept. 4th, will resume Wed. a.m. hours, going back to their previous M-F 9-5 hours on the 11th floor only,

The NY State Library genealogy section on the seventh floor will remain closed on Wednesday mornings, until they get more staffing, according to library staff. The eleventh floor facility includes both the Archives and the NY State Library Manuscripts and Special Collections unit. Both will be open, so if you find yourself in Albany on a Wednesday morning, you will be able to go up to the eleventh floor and use rare materials, archives materials, some of the census records, computer catalogs, maps, military records and the NY State vital records indexes.

The affidavit states that Daniel Warner was a soldier in the Army of the United States in the later war. Recorded 4 Feb 1812, Daniel Warner and his wife Emma of the City of New York appoint John Mannel to sell . . . the undivided Sixth portion of the land lying in Clarkstown. Any information on Daniel Warner and Emma his wife, would be appreciated.

Added note: The daughter of Thomas V.W. Warner, Emma Louise married William Kirkpatrick, son of James Fitzpatrick. They resided in Nyack on Gedney Street until the later 1800s.

ANCESTOR TABLES

In order to increase interaction between members, the Society has begun to publish Ancestor Tables, which are a brief listing of the ancestry of members. These tables will be printed in expanded editions of the newsletter for a year, after which the Board will evaluate the response and decide whether to continue publishing these tables. It is hoped that members will find distant cousins who share common lines, which will further the research efforts of both.

Other members are encouraged to submit their Ancestor Tables to Bob Protzmann, 4 Ethel Drive, New City, NY 10956, who will assist the editor in their preparation for publication.

Please note: the Genealogical Society of Rockland County and its editor are not responsible for the accuracy of the Ancestor Tables.

We remind our contributors that they should be submitting only documented ancestors. Please do not submit names that are not well documented. If there is any uncertainty, then the listing should be preceded by a "?".

Anyone interested in a particular ancestor or ancestral line should contact the submitter for details and documentation.

Anyone who has contradictory data or corrections should send a note to the Newsletter editor, or to Bob Protzmann at the address above, as well as directly to the submitter.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. We will publish these in a continuing dialogue, in the ANCESTOR TABLE FORUM.
