✓ De Ronde/De Ronda Family Newsletter —

The first issue of *De Ronde(a) Connections*, a new family newsletter, was published in December 1996 by Bob De Ronda of Oranckock, VA and John De Ronde of Pompano Beach, FL. In their welcoming message, the hosts of the newsletter write that they "expect to pay the freight using the cookie jar banking method and if any of you want to throw something in the jar to keep us rolling, it's appreciated." They plan eventually to publish the *De Ronde(a) Genealogy* and welcome all family information.

The first known De Ronde(a) ancestor in this country, according to current knowledge, was William Hendrickse De Ronde, who probably lived on Long Island, NY, but who followed the family of his bride, Magdalena Brouwer, to the wilderness of Westchester County and then probably settled in the general area of Peekskill and Montross in what was then known as Cortlandt Manor. Future generations moved south along the Hudson to Stony Point, and grandsons Abraham and Jacob (sons of Hendrick De Ronde and Catrina Lent) moved inland to the Spring Valley and Ramapo areas of Rockland County, NY.

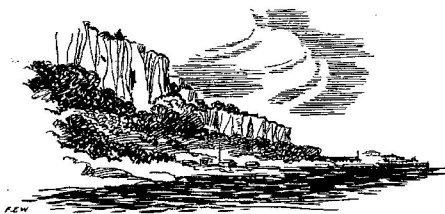

✓ Tarrytown NYG&BS/NEHGS Conference

— The third joint conference of the New York Genealogical and Biographical Society (NYG&BS) and the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS) will be held July 11 and 12 1997 at the Westchester Marriott Hotel in Tarrytown, NY.

The conference will feature two days of lectures

and programs on New York and New England genealogy by well-known genealogists, and will include a banquet and two luncheons with speakers.

The last Tarrytown conference, in 1995, was attended by almost 450 people and received rave reviews.

✓ **New England Regional Genealogical Conference** — The Fourth New England Regional Genealogical Conference (NERGC) is scheduled for April 24-27 at Cromwell, CT. The NERGC is a consortium of 30 genealogical organizations which assemble to promote a regional educational conference every 18 months in a different New England state each time.

✓ **The Computer Genealogist** — The publication formerly known as *The New England Computer Genealogist* has been renamed *The Computer Genealogist* and will be published bi-monthly. According to editor Stephen Kyner, the newsletter's original name reflected its association with its parent society, the New England Historic Genealogical Society, but the original name of the journal led people to assume it was a strictly regional publication. In fact, the publication has always featured articles of broad interest to all who use a computer in their genealogical work, without regard to regional specialization. The new name, *The Computer Genealogist*, will reflect and communicate more accurately the goals and content of the publication.

The new bi-monthly publication schedule will facilitate the expansion of the number of pages in each issue to a minimum of 20 and will allow more thorough, up-to-date, and in-depth articles.

Subscriptions are \$20.00 per year for members of the New England Historic Genealogical Society or \$30.00 per year for non-members. WALDRON —

Resolvert Waldron of Amsterdam was one of Haverstraw's early settlers. He purchased land

near Floris Falls in 1751.

David Cole's History of Rockland County (page 188) indentifies his children and grandchildren. There are nearly 100 Waldron baptisms in the Tappan Reformed Dutch Church records.

The clan is a large one and spread from the Hudson to the Ramapo Mountains in the west. They married into most of the early families.

A GENEALOGIST'S DICTIONARY OF UNUSUAL OR ARCHAIC TERMS

We'll publish this feature from time to time as we receive additions. If you discover a bewildering term and can uncover its meaning, please send it to us for future publication. Sources or contributor's names are in parentheses.

Apoplexy — Stroke; a medical condition, often found as a cause of death.

Boatswain — A naval officer in charge of the hull and related equipment. (Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot)

Carratell — A measure of capacity varying for different commodities. Also: Caroteel; Catrell.

Castor — A hat originally of beaver fur. Also: Demy Castor.

Centaph — The word "centaph" engraved on a tombstone indicates an empty grave, with the stone erected in honor of or in memory of an individual who may actually be buried elsewhere, or whose remains were unavailable; often erected in honor of a person lost at sea.

Consort — The term "consort" was used to describe a woman whose husband survived her.

Coxswain — A sailor who had charge of a ship's boat and its crew. (Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot)

Dryfat — A large container (cask, barrel or box) used to hold dry commodities. Also: dryfatt; fatt; fft; tte.

Fustian — A cloth made of cotton and flax.

Hogshead — A cask for liquids and other commodities; of wine a measure of 63 gallons. Also: hhd.

Hundred — A measure of weight or quantity, with variations in either use. The hundredweight could be metric (gunpowder was in very early colonial times 100 lbs. to the cwt.) or avoirdupois (usually 112 lbs., but with variations). Sugar, spices, and wax were in early colonial times 108 lbs. to the cwt. Also: C; cwt.

Kilderkin — A cask. Also a measure of capacity, usually for butter. In very early colonial times the kilderkin of butter or soap conformed to the 16-gallon capacity of the ale kilderkin, the cask usually weighing 13 lbs. and the butter 112 lbs. There could be variations: 128 lbs. "caske and all" for butter; 115 lbs. "caske and all" for "clean butter." Also: killderkin; kln.

Marasmus — An infantile debility; a condition in which a child is unable to absorb nutrition from food.

Matross — Member of a train of artillery who assisted the gunner in loading, firing and sponging the gun. (Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot)

Patent — In the colonial period in what became the United States, the word "patent" was used as the legal term for an instrument by which the land was conveyed and over which the public authorities exercised the right of confirmation. The word was also used to designate a tract of land itself. A deed obtained from the Indian owners, alone, was not enough to transfer absolute title. The purchase still had to be confirmed by the Governor of the Province in the form of a grant, or patent, made to the buyer. In addition, a survey was required made by the Surveyor General of the Province, showing the extent of the land involved and as a prerequisite of the transaction. (Howard I. Durie, in "The Sandstone Homesteads of Montvale, Past and Present" serialized in *Relics*, the newsletter of the Pascack Historical Society, No. 114 January 1977), p. 3.

Relict — The term "relict" indicates that the woman so described was a widow.

Straightened — Out of fire wood. Hence, a family in "straightened circumstances" had depleted their wood pile and was out of fuel. (Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot) ■

ANCESTOR TABLES

In order to increase interaction between members, the Society has begun to publish Ancestor Tables, which are a brief listing of the ancestry of members. These tables will be printed in expanded editions of the newsletter for a year, after which the Board will evaluate the response and decide whether to continue publishing these tables. It is hoped that members will find distant cousins who share common lines, which will further the research efforts of both.

Other members are encouraged to submit their Ancestor Tables to Bob Protzmann, 4 Ethel Drive, New City, NY 10956, who will assist the editor in their preparation for publication.

Please note: the Genealogical Society of Rockland County and its editor are not responsible for the accuracy of the Ancestor Tables.

We remind our contributors that they should be submitting only documented ancestors. Please do not submit names that are not well documented. If there is any uncertainty, then the listing should be preceded by a "?".

Anyone interested in a particular ancestor or ancestral line should contact the submitter for details and documentation.

Anyone who has contradictory data or corrections should send a note to the Newsletter editor, or to Bob Protzmann at the address above, as well as directly to the submitter.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. We will publish these in a continuing dialogue, in the ANCESTOR TABLE FORUM.

Your No. 400, Robert Sneden/Snethen, Sr. was the son of Claes (Nicholas) Sneden and his wife, Maria. Robert was born by 1675 or earlier in New Amsterdam/New York City, and died after January 1734.

Robert Sneden was listed as a Freeman in the Flushing Precinct in a census of 1698. The Oyster Bay Town Records contain deed and other information pertaining to his business activities. On Jan. 4, 1697 Robert Sneathing of Flushing bought from John Boud of Oyster Bay "a certain Island or Neck of land containg about 50 acres lying within ye bounds of Oysterbay, northward from Musketa Cove as the same is now laid out and marked." Musketa Cove is now the Glen Cove locality.

On Oct. 16, 1704 Robert Snething, house carpenter, bought from Daniel Simkins of "Musketacove" in bounds of Oyster Bay, for 21 pounds, a lot of 9-1/4 acres and 4 rods within the limits of Musketacove Patent, bordering land of Robert Snething and Nicholas Snething. Daniel Simkins was last mentioned at Oyster Bay about 1706; by 1710 Daniel was at Greenwich (then called Cohansey) in Cumberland County, N.J. in the same area as Robert Sneden's brother, Joseph Snethen, and Joseph's son, Nicholas.

On Jan. 4, 1713, Robert Sneathing of the Township of Oysterbay, Queens County, N.Y., yeoman, sold to Adrean Hegman of Township of Brockland, Kings County, for consideration of 400 pounds, 3 tracts of land in Township of Oysterbay. He signed "Robart Senethen." Sarah "Senathen" also signed with her mark.

The family moved to the Eastchester locality of Westchester County, N.Y. about the time of the following purchase: Deed dated Dec. 1, 1713, recorded in Book E, p. 53, Richard Osburn of Eastchester, yeoman, and wife, to Robert Snealling of Queens County on ye Island of Nassau, yeoman (called Sneathing in rest of deed) for consideration of 340 pounds covering several tracts in Patent of Eastchester, etc. Additional land was purchased Jan. 16, 1726 from Isaac Odell for 150 pounds (Deed F, p. 169), in which grantee's name is spelled "Sneadden." His Cattle Mark was entered Nov. 1, 1723 (Deed book E, p. 379).

The name of Robert Sneddon, Snedon, Sneadon, Sneedon, Sneaddon, is found in records of Town of Eastchester; he serving, beginning in 1715 and through 1729, in various duties as Treasurer, Appraiser of intestate estates, Sheepmaster, Fence Viewer, Overseer of Highways, Trustee, School Committee and Common Lands Committee.

Robert Sneden disposed of his real estate in Eastchester by the following deeds:

Book G, p. 171, dated Jan. 18, 1734, Robert "Snedden Senr." (Snewden) yeoman to son, Robert

Snedden, Junr., carpenter, for consideration of 100 pounds.

Book G, p. 196, dated Jan. 16, 1734, Robert Sneden, yeoman, and Sarah, his wife, to James Burling of N.Y., merchant, for consideration of 75 pounds.

Book G, p. 344, dated Jan. 31, 1734, Robert Sneden, yeoman, "for consideration of love and affection" to son Samuel Sneden, "for the advancement of his said son" land in Eastchester bounded by devises of Lewis Guion, deceased.

This Robert may have been the same Robert Sneathing at whose home, apparently in the vicinity of Rye (Westchester County), New York, occasional Quaker meetings were held in 1727.

Robert Sneden, Sr., died at an unknown date without a recorded estate.

Robert Sneden and his wife Sara -?- had children (order unknown):

— 1. Nicholas Sneden: probably the oldest child; mentioned in the will of his uncle, Nicholas Snethen, who died in 1715. No further record.

— 2. Robert Sneden, Jr., b. probably after 1713 Westchester County, NY; d. prob. by 1754; (prob) married Mary (Mollie) Dobbs of Dobbs Ferry, and moved to the west side of the Hudson River about 1740 (to the locality that came to be called Sneden's Landing, in Orange County (the section that was later set off as Rockland County) NY. She was the well-known Mollie Sneden of the Ferry.

— 3. Samuel Sneden, b. as early as 1713; d. just prior to December 1783; married Sarah Ward, daughter of Stephen Ward of Ward's Island. They lived at Eastchester in Westchester County, NY.

— 4. Abigail Sneden, married 24 November 1721 New York City (NYC Ref Dutch Ch) Joseph Winslow. He was born 16 June 1677 at Boston; died 6 April 1761 Dutchess County, N.Y.

— 5. (poss) Sarah Sneden, married John Haviland. He was b. about 169?, son of Benjamin and Abigail Haviland.

— 6. (poss) Elizabeth Sneden, married John Fowler of Eastchester.

Robert Sneden's father was Claes Sneden/Snethen, who came to New Amsterdam in December 1657 on the *St. Jean Baptiste* under Captain Symon Claesen bound for the Dutch settlement of New Amstel (later called New Castle) on the Delaware River. On the same ship was his brother, Jan Sneden, and Jan's wife, Grietje, and their two children.

Claes Sneden and his (probably older) brother, Jan, founders of the Sneden family in America, were once thought to have been descended from a family who were said to have lived for many years in Amsterdam. The only clue to this assumption seems to have been that Jan, his family, and his brother Claes,

sailed from Amsterdam. It now seems likely, that the family may have lived for some time in England (and may have originated in Scandinavia or Germany), coming to the Netherlands, specifically Leiden and/or Amsterdam, in the early 1600s. Individuals with variations of the surname have been found in England (particularly in Devon and Dorset) in records kept between 1192 and 1750. Among the various surname spellings found on English records are Snaydon, Snedon, Sneydon, Snoudon, and Snaedyns.

Claes settled in New Amsterdam. His surname is often found spelled "Sneding." Witnesses at the baptisms of his children were Geertie Langendyck (at Maria's baptism), Claertie Ebels (at Grietje's baptism), and Marritie Hendr. Van Haerlem (at the 4th listed child's baptism; in the record, no first name is given for the child). Claes Sneden may have lived in Flushing near the Genungs (his niece Grietje, dau. of Jan Sneden, married Jean Geunon/Genung). He was known to have been there after 1667.

In 1675 a Nicholas Snathan was taxed at Flushing for "2 landes, 10 madoes [meadows], 1 horses mares, 2 oxen and boles, 3 cowes, 2 two-yere oldes, 2 yerlings. Brought in Oct. 9, 1675."

Nicholas (Claes) Snethin died at Flushing in or prior to December 1677, leaving a will in which his wife Mary was appointed sole executrix. The will is not recorded, but is referred to in "Letters of Adminis-

tration" granted to "Mary, the widow of Nicholas Snethin" September 16, 1678 by Sir Edmond Andross, the proof having been made before the Court of Sessions held at Jamaica for the North Riding "in the month of December last" (1677).

Claes married by 1662 Maria/Mary -?- and they had children (first four bp. NYC Ref Dutch Ch):

- 1. Sara Sneding, bp. 30 May 1663
- 2. Maria Sneding, bp. 26 April 1664
- 3. Grietje Sneding, bp. 22 Sep 1666. No further record.
- 4. -?- Sneeding, bp. 6 Nov 1667 [no given name in bp. record; this child may be identical to Nicholas, below]
- 5. Nicholas Sneden, d. 1715; m. by 6 July 1696 Dorothy Roots.
- 6. Robert Sneden, m. Sarah -?-.
- 7. Joseph Sneden, b. before 1677 Flushing, L.I.; d. Salem, NJ; m. Rachel -?-.
- 8. Abigail Sneden, prob. m. Garret Albertsen.

Joseph Snethen, Sarah Snethen, Mary Snethen, and Abigail Snethen were listed in the August 31st 1698 census of Hempstead, Queens County, N.Y. ■
