✓ **Blauvelt Reunion** — On September 20, 1997, the Association of Blauvelt Descendants will hold the 71st Annual Family Reunion at the Old '76 House, 100 Main Street, Tappan, NY. The reunion will begin at 9 a.m. with a business meeting and a presentation on the '76 House. There will be an afternoon tour of the nearby DeWint House with a presentation by the curator on its use as a Headquarters for General Washington. Dinner will be at 7 p.m.

Blauvelt Association members are descendants of Gerrit Hendricks, who arrived from Holland in 1638. Gerrit landed at Wilmington, Delaware, served his indenture at the Van Rensselaer Estate in New York, settled briefly in New Amsterdam, and finally in Tappan, at what is now known as Blauvelt, NY. Gerrit received a land grant in the Tappan area, and seven of his sons built homes there. The Old '76 House is noted as the site of imprisonment of Major Andre during the Revolutionary War. General Washington stayed at the DeWint House during this episode. Major Frederick Blauvelt was married to the DeWint's daughter, and he made the arrangement for the General to stay at the house and use it for his headquarters.

✓ NYC Death Certificates Hot Line — The

New York City Department of Health has established a telephone hot line to take orders with a credit card for death certificates: 212-788-4505. When using this hot line, there is a \$5 service fee in addition to the standard charges, and callers will be asked several questions to verify that they are related to the deceased. ■

Dates of the Federal Census

Enumerators of the census were instructed to take the census as of a designated date regardless of when they visited. If the visit was made after the set date, babies born after that date were not to be included (but deaths generally were). "Official" Federal Census dates were:

1790-1820 — First Monday in August.
1830-1900 — June 1
1910 — Apr 15
1920 — Jan 20
1930-1980 — Apr 1

— **BUSH** —

Derick Bush of Hempstead died 4 May 1829; his will was probated 8 May (B-235). His daughter Maria, born 1798, d. 23 April 1890, married John Dater, born 1795, died 7 Jan 1871. Maria received 45 acres with the grist mill from her father by his will. He had received a mill lot with the grist mill by the will of his father, Peter.

Maria and John Dater had two daughters: (1) Ann Eliza, d. 1904; married William B. Conklin; (2) Fannie, d. 7 May 1901; m. William B. -?.

Ann Eliza and William B. Conklin lived on the Bush property on Cherry Lane, Tallman. They had four children: William H., Louise, James B., and John D.

The family farm was said to have been a King James grant — a Dutch square mile. Early in this century it was about 1800 acres.

The will of Derick Bush mentions these

children and great-grandchildren: Peter; Henry; Mary (Maria) wife of John Dater; Jane, wife of Isaac Post, her daughter (no not named), first wife of William Armstrong; Margaret, wife of Peter Bush; Famitye, wife of Garret Van Riper; Caty, wife of Derick H. Wanmaker; Anny, wife of John Vanderbeak; Elizabeth, wife of Andrew Henion; sons Christian & Richard John; son Richard received 60 acres with the saw mill.

From Saddle River marriages: Peter W. Bush m. Mary DeBaan (DeBaun); Conrad Bush m. Mary Smith; David Bush m. Ann DeBaan, Richard Bush m. Maria Herring (Haring).

If you search out the name Sholters in the other churches, you will discover it's really Shultz.

There are at least four Peter Bushes and it's impossible to tell one from the other.

These are the children of Dirk Bush, mentioned in his will:

(1) Jannitie, bp. 16 Feb 1783 Hackensack. In Father's will. Married 18 Dec 1813 Saddle River Ref Dutch Church, Isaac Post.

(2) Jan, bp. 4 Dec 1784 Paramus. In father's will. Married Henrietta -?- 13 April 1811 Paramus Church. Died 24 Feb 1827; buried Saddle River Ref Dutch Ch Cem.

(3) Grietje, bp. 24 Dec 1786 Paramus. In father's will. Wife of Peter Bush (married 25 Aug 1804 Paramus).

(4) Hendrick, bp. 29 April 1789 Paramus. In father's will. Married Antye Van Ryper 4 Feb 1809 Paramus.

(5) Antye, bp. 19 July 1795 Paramus. In father's will. Married John Vanderbeek 11 Feb 1815 Saddle River Ref Dutch Church. Buried Valteau Cemetery in Ridgewood, NJ. Died 14 May 1876.

(6) Dirk, bp. 1 April 1798 Paramus. In father's will.

(7) Elizabeth, bp. 4 Feb 1802 Paramus. In father's will. Married Andrew Hennion April 1817 at West New Hempstead Dutch Church. Buried Churchyard, Mahwah, NJ Died 9 July 1823, aged 22.5.27.

(8) Catherine, bp. 17 Feb 1805. In father's will. (Donna Ristenbatt's line)

(9) Peter. In father's will.
Other children of Dirk Bush were:

Mary, married 15 May 1819 John Dator at West New Hempstead Dutch Church. From 1850 census of Ramapo, she was born 1798.

Famitye, from father's will married Garret Van Ryper 12 April 1817 West New Hempstead Dutch Church.

Good luck with the Peter Bushes. There are so many it's hard to keep them straight. ■

GSRC UPDATES

■ **President's Message** — A number of changes have taken place within the structure of the Genealogical Society of Rockland County during the past several months. Most important among them is the move towards incorporation of the society. Papers have been filed with the Secretary of State seeking status as a Not-For-Profit Corporation, pending final approval.

Towards this end, it was necessary to rewrite the Society by-laws, so that we would comply with the various requirements for incorporation. The new by-laws were read at the September 1996 meeting, and were unanimously adopted at the meeting of October 22nd, 1996. The most important change was the inclusion of a named Board of Trustees to manage the business and affairs of the Society.

It was "Standing Room Only" in the auditorium at the New City Library on Sunday January 19th, when a program on the "ABCs of Genealogy" was presented there by members of the society. A fine presentation by Marie Koestler, Sally Dewey, Robert Protzmann, Les Baisley and Doug Renud, with technical assistance from Joe Ohliger, warrants a sincere vote of appreciation. Thanks guys!

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The Rockland Room, at the New City Library, 220 North Main Street, New City (Rockland County), NY is open during regular library hours: 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday; noon to 9 p.m. Friday; 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday; and noon to 8 p.m. Sunday.

The Rockland Room has over 3,000 volumes of county and state history, government, natural history, and genealogy. The library holds a microfilm collection of Rockland newspapers, including the *Rockland Journal-News* from 1850 to the present. There are New York federal census records from 1790 to 1920; and New York state census records from 1860 to 1925.

The library also has Clarkstown high school yearbooks from 1936 to the present; and telephone books on microfilm dating back to 1883.

There are more than 50 bound volumes of Rockland County family histories, cemetery and church records, and a Patriot Index of Revolutionary War soldiers.

Sally Pelligrini, Librarian at the Rockland Room, plans a fall workshop to discuss the military records held by the library.

Myths About Our American Ancestors

by R. L. Guffin

Myth 1 - When our American ancestors moved they always moved West.

Fact: While most early settlers came to the eastern shore of North America, it was logical for most expansionist movements to flow westward. However, there are many documented cases showing movement northward, southward or back to the East after pioneers became less than enchanted with raw frontier.

Myth 2 - Because of travel conditions, prior to the railroads, families rarely moved more than once or twice in a lifetime.

Fact: A study of Revolutionary War pension applications reveals that many of these veterans moved six or more times and quite often lived in as many different states.

Myth 3 - Our ancestors usually moved, like Abraham, not knowing where they were going.

Fact: In-depth study into the migratory habits of our ancestors shows that in most cases they had received many reports on an "ideal" location by which they were convinced they would better themselves by moving. Sometimes, they relied on reports from relatives or neighbors who had already moved, but often a member of a family would make a preliminary trip to check out the new territory. The move usually involved several families making the trip together.

Myth 4 - Most American men were devoutly religious at the time of the American Revolution.

Fact: While most colonists gave nominal adherence to Christian values in the late eighteenth century, some historians have estimated that no more than 15 percent of the men were church members.

Myth 5 - Immediately following the American Revolution, most Southern churchmen were either Baptist or Methodist.

Fact: Following the Revolution War, the majority of Southerners of Anglo-Saxon heritage who were church members still belonged to the successor of the Anglican Church in America, the Protestant Episcopal Church. The second largest number of churchmen were the Scotch-Irish Presbyterians. The great movement to the Methodist and Baptist Churches came in the early part of the nineteenth century.

Myth 6 - Most Southern families were slave owners just prior to the Civil War.

Fact: The majority of the white Southern heads of households never owned a slave. This is substantiated through a study of slave census records.

Myth 7 - Most of the wealth of America was in Northern states just prior to the Civil War.

Fact: While industrial growth in the North had exceeded that in the South, the southeast had experienced an era of economic prosperity in the middle of the nineteenth century and, as a result, six of the ten wealthiest states in the Union in 1860 were below the Mason-Dixon Line.

Myth 8 - Due to the lack of major industry, there were no large cities in the South at the outbreak of the Civil War.

Fact: It is true that most of the large cities in the country were along the eastern seaboard during the 1850s. However, according to the 1850 census, New Orleans was the fifth largest city in the U. S., ranking just behind Philadelphia. The population of this major Southern port city at the time was 116,375.

Myth 9 - Most American males were involved in some kind of military action between the American Revolution and the Civil War.

Fact: There were a number of wars on Southern soil, between 1783 and 1865, including battles of the War of 1812, the War with Mexico and several Indian Wars. However, the majority of males in this country never participated in any kind of military action beyond a militia drill during this time period.

ANCESTOR TABLES

In order to increase interaction between members, the Society has begun to publish Ancestor Tables, which are a brief listing of the ancestry of members. These tables will be printed in expanded editions of the newsletter for a year, after which the Board will evaluate the response and decide whether to continue publishing these tables. It is hoped that members will find distant cousins who share common lines, which will further the research efforts of both.

Other members are encouraged to submit their Ancestor Tables to Bob Protzmann, 4 Ethel Drive, New City, NY 10956, who will assist the editor in their preparation for publication.

Please note: the Genealogical Society of Rockland County and its editor are not responsible for the accuracy of the Ancestor Tables.

We remind our contributors that they should be submitting only documented ancestors. Please do not submit names that are not well documented. If there is any uncertainty, then the listing should be preceded by a "?".

Anyone interested in a particular ancestor or ancestral line should contact the submitter for details and documentation.

Anyone who has contradictory data or corrections should send a note to the Newsletter editor, or to Bob Protzmann at the address above, as well as directly to the submitter.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even

numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above.
