✓ **Diary of a Yankee Engineer** — In 1863, a Rockland County native in the Union Army, John H. Westervelt, began sending his journal entries and drawings to his 13-year-old son, Frazee. Now, thanks to the efforts of Anita Palladino, a high school librarian and member of the Rockland County Historical Society, the book has been published, with Palladino as editor, by Fordham University Press, as *Diary of a Yankee Engineer: The Civil War Story of John H. Westervelt, Engineer, 1st New York Volunteer Engineer Corps*.

That the journal was not lost is a fortuitous

event: in 1927 Anita Palladino's stepfather had pulled it from the trash from behind a house that was being renovated, and many years later, he gave it to her. Westervelt's words give a realistic look at day-to-day soldiering - frequently tedious and without glory.

✓ **Wortendyke Barn Museum** — The Wortendyke Barn on Pascack Road, in Park Ridge, NJ, will be reopened as a new agricultural museum on Sunday, September 28, with a ceremony at 2 p.m. Tours of the barn museum will follow and refreshments will be served. The barn was erected on a farm owned by Frederick Wortendyke, Jr., whose house, still standing across the road, was built about 1750. Dutch barns, a unique and distinctive architectural type, were once numerous in our region, but today, this Dutch barn is one of only six remaining in Bergen County. The barn museum will be open to the public for two weeks after the opening, on Wednesday 1-5; and Sundays, 1-5. It will then close for the winter, and will reopen in the spring. ✓ **Regional Archives to Remain Open** — In a letter dated 21 July 1997, in response to a query written by Richard Peterson, John W. Carlin, Archivist of the United States wrote: "Thank you for your recent letter expressing concern that the regional archives branches of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) may be closed. Let me assure you this is absolutely not true. The regional archives remain a vital part of NARA." Mr. Carlin goes on to acknowledge that to operate more cost-effectively, NARA is in the midst of making immediate and long-term changes in the way it operates. Regional archives and Federal records have been consolidated into regional centers. NARA is currently investigating long-term strategies, including consolidation and relocation of archives and records, but, according to Carlin, "Should consolidation of our archival records become necessary, we will ensure that our microfilm collections heavily used by genealogists remain accessible in the locations where the records are now." ■

## ANSWERS TO QUERIES

❖ From Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot, 150 Johnstontown Rd., Sloatsburg, NY 10974:

Re: Query #131 in May 1997 newsletter —

**FREDERICK** —

Henry Frederick may be another son of Peter. He died in 1841. A son Peter H. (wife Catherine Quackenbush) predeceased him in 1833. Henry

was a supporter of the First Baptist Church in Viola about 1815.

Circumstantial: Fredericks who were taxpayers in 1812: Henry (grist mill); Robert (grist mill); Hendrick (mill); Peter. Cole notes that Henry, Abram, Peter, and James Fredericks supplied produce to Ramapo Works 1798-1814. Henry supplied teams for carting. (Leads - not proof).

Early Fredericks (Friedrich) included Peter Frederick, a Dutch citizen and a smith; lived in Rotterdam. He d. 6 April 1715. His daughter Margaretha was born 13 July 1679.

Conrad Frederick (Hunter Lists #212) went from Holland to England in the 5th party of Palatines in 1709. He was from the Nassau-Darmstadt region. In 1710 he was 52, wife Anna Maria Wysing 45; John Peter 14; John Henry 13.

He was first settled at West Camp; moved to the Ramapo Tract in 1713 when the colony was disbanded. Children: Johann William, d.y.; Johann Henrich, d.y.; Johann Peter (b. 1696); Johann Conrad (b. 1697); Maria Christina (b. 1699), m. John Wendel Fuchs (Fox).

Peter married June 1717 at Campua (Campgaw) near Ramabuch (Ramapo), NJ to Anna Dorothea DeMuth at her father's home. Peter was a delegate to the Lutheran Assembly in 1735. Children: Anna Maria, b. 19 June 1720 Mauwe (Mahwah), bp. Ramabuch; Conrad, bp. 17 Feb 1723; Maria, b. 11 June 1731 at Wagha; bp. Hackensack.

There are three Frederick stones in the Moffat Road Cemetery in Mahwah: Abraham, b. 1762, d. 1810 age 48; Henry, b. 23 Dec 1729, d. 30 Jan 1790; Henry, under age 3, d. 1794.

Hester Haring, b. 18 Sep 1792; d. 30 Mar 1854; m. 20 March 1812 North Schraalenburgh Ref Ch (Dumont, NJ), Joost George Lozier. Hester was the dau. of Jacob Haring and his wife, Femetje (Phebe) Romer. Jacob Haring, Hester's father, was b. 7 Feb 1756; d. 24 May 1815. His parents were Cornelius Haring and Magdalena Goetschius.

Re: Query #124 in February 1997 newsletter — **ROMER** —

There was a Romer family associated with the

Saddle River Dutch Reformed Church (in present day Upper Saddle River, NJ), and, in fact Phebe Romer, wife of Jacob Herring/Haring was buried there. Her surname on the tombstone, according to a list of tombstone inscriptions is "Boomer."

Other spellings I've seen of the name are Bomar and Bonnard.

Here are three "Romer" women buried at Saddle River Ref Chyd (including Hester Romer):

Ada Lee Romer, wife of Edmund L. Maeder, was b. 15 Aug 1862; d. 28 March 1925; buried Saddle River Ref Chyd (with a DAR marker, Pascack Chapter)

Elisabeth Romer, b. about 1788; d. 23 April 1855, ae 68; buried Saddle River Ref Chyd; m. Henry Cunningham. They had children bp. Saddle River Ref Ch. from 1814-1833.

Phebe Romer, wife of Jacob Herring, d. 21 March 1852 in her 83rd year; buried Saddle River Ref Chyd.

Re: Query #129 in May 1997 newsletter — **VAN TASSEL** —

Van Tassel. William Van Tassel (Bill) known as "Black Hawk," was the son of John Van Tassel and Eliza Morgan. This branch of Van Tassels claimed to have Indian blood.

Amanda Jones (his wife). Daughter of Walter Jones borm ca 1803 and Sylvia Marvin of Lake Mombasha. Walter was the son of John Jones and Sarah Smith. This branch of Jones claimed descent from Jonas Jones of Wales.

Jeanette Lewis was the daughter of Edward Lewis and Sally Gannon of Sterling Mines. She married William McGrady. He served in the Civil War and his widow received a pension. Sally Gannon was the daughter of Saul Gannon and Eliza Becraft. She was probably the daughter of Michael Becraft of Orange Co., not the Becrafts in Rockland County. This Gannon family came from Mombasha, between Monroe and Southfields, to Sterling Mines.

## Military Pension Records —

The first US Military Pension Law was passed in 1792 to provide aid to disabled veterans of the Revolutionary War. Later pensions were extended to anyone who had served. In 1818, a veteran had to prove actual need; in 1820 a veteran had to prove need and submit a schedule of his estate, perhaps a copy of a deed showing that he had disposed of all property. After 1828, all veterans were granted pensions. The 1836 Widow's Act provided that the widow of a Revolutionary War veteran could claim his pension. The widow had to prove relationship and establish that they had been married before the war ended. After 1854 widows were eligible for a pension regardless of the date of the marriage. Many eligible widows did not apply.

## The Starr Family

*Program presented by Marjorie Stevenot at the April 22, 1997 meeting of the Genealogical Society of Rockland County*

Marjorie gave credit to Florence Anderson and Miral Haubner for sharing information which helped her a great deal with researching this family. In addition, Lorna Starr Marsico's sister, who lives in Aruba, provided much information on the younger generations. Marjorie's interest in this family is part of a six-family genealogy of people who lived in the Ramapo Mountains, the other five families being Becraft, Call, Charleston, Hogencamp, and Pitt.

Aaron Starr appeared in the 1790 Federal census. At that time he had two sons under 16; one son over 16; two daughters, and one wife. He had served in the Revolution. He was employed at the Sterling Furnace, and on subsequent censuses appeared in Franklin Township, New Jersey. He probably lived in the vicinity of Wortendyke. He was born ca 1748, which means he was here before the Revolution.

As she tried to go back further, she was not sure if Starr was his original name, since only stories and tales existed. James Starr, 6th generation from Aaron, spoke of the early days in Pine Meadow. He said that his grandfather, Aaron, insisted that the first Aaron was forced to leave Ireland to flee the British Army. James killed his son in the 1880s and was committed to a mental hospital.

Joe Rose told the story that the first immigrant "jumped ship" and went to Pine Meadow with the Conklins and Babcocks. Some people believe this Starr family may be descended from the original Starrs in England. Marjorie has checked a Dr. Comfort Starr of New England, but cannot find a connection. When she checked immigration records of 1805 and 1811, there was one Starr from Londonderry and one from County Tyrone (Northern Ireland).

Next we find Daniel (born 1788; died 1862); he is buried in Ladentown. Unfortunately, she has not been able to find a descendant of Daniel. Samuel was born in 1790 — he was the only person in Pine Meadow on the 1854 map. These two were probably brothers. However, there is a big gap here. No deed can be found for Samuel, yet he lived near Pine Meadow Brook on the old Woodtown Turnpike. He married Mary Ann Snyder in 1811. The 1870 census says his house had no value, and in 1880 he lived in the Almshouse. Old Samuel had three children: Samuel, Jr., who served in the Civil War; Elias Napoleon; and Emma J.

Marjorie has been told that a number of Starrs were

buried in the Conklin Cemetery or Starr Cemetery, both of which are now under Pine Meadow Lake. Pine Meadow itself is about 4 miles over the mountain from Ladentown, where there is also a family plot. Some of them left the mountains for Spring Valley, Hillburn, Garnerville, and Mt. Ivy. There was some intermarriage, but very few contrary to canon law.

Daniel and Eliza Starr married two Conklins. In the census there is a gap of ten years. There were probably more children, but she cannot find a record of them. Daniel's land was sold, on his death, to the Palisades Park Commission. He had two daughters — Margaret, who married -?- Courter, and Mary Ann. Both daughters lived in Allendale at marriage. Daniel also had a son, John (Lorna, our visitor, is his descendant), who married twice — a Johnson and a Conklin. Many Starrs married Conklins.

Marjorie did find some Starrs in Orange County who were born in New Jersey. However, she is sure they are not of this line. The spelling is seen sometimes as Storr — as the German Palatines (Lutheran) around Newburgh. Some of them moved down to Mahwah, NJ and built the church there. Most of the Ramapo Mountain Starr family marriages seemed to take place in Methodist churches. Unfortunately, she has been unable to locate any baptismal records for these Starrs.

With passing years, stories and tales are handed down, but most have been embellished and are dubious in fact. However, they should all be checked out, for there is usually some hint of truth to them.

Marjorie plans to proceed to publish the book on the six genealogies, so that as it gets out, people hopefully will be able to fill in the gaps. This is a business for her — she has to pay a printer, so she has to charge for the book. New bits of information keep coming in, so she is not sure when it will be published. ■

**Please note: the Genealogical Society of Rockland County and its editor are not responsible for the accuracy of the Ancestor Tables.**

We remind our contributors that they should be submitting only documented ancestors. Please do not submit names that are not well documented. If there is any uncertainty, then the listing should be preceded by a "?".

Anyone interested in a particular ancestor or ancestral line should contact the submitter for details and documentation.

Anyone who has contradictory data or corrections should send a note to the Newsletter editor, or to Bob Protzmann at the address above, as well as directly to the submitter.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. ## ANCESTOR TABLE FORUM

From Loyola T. Vuolo, 6 Oak Lane, Verona, NJ 07044-2231, regarding #1104, #1105 and #2210, ancestors of Donald Norman Van Epps (Genealogical

Society of Rockland County Newsletter Vol. 11, No. 4, May 1997) — From The Bogart Family, John A. Bogart (1959), Chap. I, "Other Bogart Pioneers in New Netherland," p. 14\*:

Dr. Harmen Myndert Van Der Bogaert, of Zeeland, Holland, was born in 1612. He came here in 1631 as surgeon and physician on the ENDRACHT. He was appointed surgeon at Fort Orange (Albany) in 1633, and in 1635, he was sent to the Seneca and Oneida country to establish closer relations with the Indians. He returned to New Amsterdam where, in 1638, he made a will in which he bequeathed his property there to his future wife, Jillisje Claesje of Ziericksz, Holland, daughter of Claez Cornelisz Swits who in 1642 was murdered by an Indian in Manhattan Island. After his return from a West Indies cruise in the yacht, LA GRACE, he married Jillisje Claesz, and had at least two children — Francois, baptized in New Amsterdam, August 26, 1640 and Myndert, baptized 3 May 1643. In 1645 he was again appointed Commissary at Albany. He was burned to death in the Indian country on the Mohawk River in 1647. His descendants settled in Albany, Schenectady, Kingston, Poughkeepsie and other Hudson Valley settlements. (The compiler has long felt that Dr. Bogaert may have had other children whose birth or baptism was not recorded.)
