# ✓ Rockland County Marriage Records — Rockland County Marriage Records, 1908-1926 (certificates in bound volumes) are located in the Search Room of the County Clerk's office at New City, NY. They are indexed. They include age, residence, birthplace, occupation of both bride and groom; names of fathers, maiden names of mothers; birthplaces; usually where marriage took place and who officiated. An excellent no-fee source. [Thanks to Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot for this information.]

# ✓ Hillburn Presbyterian Church Register — The Hillburn church was closed by the Presbytery this spring and the Register destined for a vault in Westchester. Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot contacted Rev. William Hawley of the Presbytery of the Hudson River. He has generously donated a copy of the marriages, baptism, and funerals since 1927. Marie Koestler has agreed to index the Register. Earlier records of the Hillburn congregation are in the Ramapo Presbyterian Church Register which has already been published.

- ✓ Multiple Mailings A member suggests that if you send identical letters or data to a group of people, please note their names on each letter. Most are happy to help, but would like to avoid needless duplication. Also, please enclose an SASE (stamped, Self-Addressed Envelope) for answers. E-mail, while used by many, is not universal.
- ✓ Authenticate Tradition A top genealogist, Milton Rubincam, who died recently (obituary NY Times 14 Sep 1997), unearthed major flaws in his family's tradition. He was told that the name was French, meant "field of blood" and that he was descended from Charlemagne. He found the name was German and meant something like "field of turnips." His wife regarded herself as a descendant of a signer of the Declaration of Independence. She was, in fact, descended from a Revolutionary War general through his illicit child whom he fathered with the nurse of his legitimate daughter! What "grandmother always said" isn't necessarily so! # **Starr Family Corrections and Additions**

Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot wrote to correct the summary of her presentation on the Starr family (a summary of the talk was printed in the September Newsletter):

Daniel Starr, b. c. 1788, buried Ladentown, is an enigma. A stone rubbing confirms Budke's findings: died August 8, 1862 age 74, a soldier in Co. K. Is this reasonable? He does not appear on any Civil War list or in the 1850 NY or NJ Censuses. Did the engraver make an error for

Daniel, b. c. 1814, died 1882?

Samuel Starr (1790) had at least 7 or 8 children. Samuel Starr Jr. (d. Civil War) m. Catherine Scott and had children: Mary A., Elias Napoleon, and Emma J.

Margaret Starr, dau. of Daniel, married Aaron Courter.

John I. Starr m. (1) Loretta Johnson. He married

(2) Ellen Conklin.

Living heirs of Daniel & Loretta (1919) were: Emma Smith (Passaic Co., NJ); Juliann Conklin; Mary Ann Babcock; John I. Starr (m. #1 Loretta Johnson; m. #2 Ellen Conklin); Margaret (called Kruder) Courter; Aaron Starr; Charles.

James Starr b. 1916 killed his son 1986.

Children of Samuel Starr & Mary Ann Snyder: Daniel m. Loretta Conklin; Ellen (may be same as Elsie); Elsie m. Gavin Mather; Eliza m. Nicholas M. Conklin; Margaret; Matilda m. George W. Furman; Emma (Emily); Samuel m. Catherine Scott.

[The Starr surname] is frequently confused in the Bergen County, NJ records with Storr and Sturr. Storr families settled in Franklin Township (mahwah) near Campgaw about 1714. They were German Palatines who had been settled by the British near Newburgh in 1710 to develop naval stores. When the colony was abandoned, several families, including Storr, went to Bergen County, NJ. They participated in the building of the German log church in Mahwah.

There is an extensive genealogy on the Starr family of England. I have been unable to find any connection. In the Cromwellian era 1642-46 subscribers listed as "Adventurers for land in Ireland" included the name Starr. One of the English branches might have settled in Ireland. I have not tried to trace Starr families in Ireland. Those in Rockland County were Methodists.

Some of those who have been looking for Starr data may not be aware of the Storr/Sturr complications. There were also Starrs (sometimes spelled Storr) in Orange County in the 19th

The first Aaron Starr was in the Revolution (back pay record, Weissenfels Levies).

The Rockland Room, at the New City Library, 220 North Main Street, New City (Rockland County), NY is open during regular library hours: 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday; noon to 9 p.m. Friday; 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday; and noon to 8 p.m. Sunday.

The Rockland Room has over 3,000 volumes of county and state history, government, natural history, and genealogy. The library holds a microfilm collection of Rockland newspapers. There are New York federal census records from 1790 to 1920; and New York state census records from 1860 to 1925. The library also has telephone books on microfilm dating back to 1883 and there are more than 50 bound volumes of Rockland County family histories, cemetery and church records, and a Patriot Index of Revolutionary War soldiers.

# A Stony Point Outing, May 1932

Submitted by Richard Peterson
Amanda (Daisy) Tompkins Allison was born
23 Feb 1872, and married 11 Sep 1920 to
Charles Conover. The following story about a
trip to the historic Springsteel Farm in Stony
Point, New York, is copied verbatim from her
original handwritten account of that day's
activities.

Sunday, May 1st, 1932. Charles and I stopped for Calvin and Edith and took them with us to the Springsteel farm and showed them just where the old house stood when General Anthony Wayne stopped there on the evening of July 16th from 8 till 11:30 P.M. when he marched his troops in two columns to Stony Point fort held by the British,

capturing it at midnight.

As we stood there beside the foundation of the house (now marked only by dirt and sod) Edith suggested our getting Mr. Matthew DeCamp to identify the spot also, as he, having been born and raised right in the neighborhood, probably was acquainted with this historic spot. So we drove over to his house on Mormontown Road (about 1/4 mile). He stood at his gate. When Calvin introduced us all he readily agreed to show us the spot desired. "Sure," he said, "I've known it all my life." Chas, Edith and I drove about 1/4 miles further on before we found room to turn, this Mormontown Road is so narrow. When we came back, Calvin and Mr. DeCamp had walked about 1/4 of the distance to the Springsteel farm. They got into the car — Mr. DeCamp in the front seat. We said nothing as to where my father had told us the farm and farm house were located, so he directed Charles. When we reached the entrance bars of the stone fence of the farm he said "Stop," but Charles drove on about 10 or fifteen feet so Mr. DeCamp could get out with greater ease. He is very sprightly in spite of his stooped back, bowed by hard work as a ships carpenter, and he ran across the road, quickly climbed the stone wall and stood on the very spot my father stands on in our picture taken there by Bruce, of father, Fred, Perry and me. Standing there Mr. DeCamp gave us the DeCamp lineage as he could recall off hand. It was as follows.

"My father was Sidney DeCamp and he married Lena James. They went to live at his father's (Matthew James DeCamp) in Crickettown Road. Johanna Decker was Matthew James DeCamp's wife. These folks said, "Go take an acre for yours of this place." Well, he did, and built a house on it where Frank Hoyt lives now. Unfortunately, he did not have his gift in writing (as he had no writing) and there was trouble about it and he lost the property. They intended moving away but he died there."

Their son Matthew was born there. Matthew DeCamp says "My father and grandparents used to tell me all about Mad Anthony Wayne and the Springsteel farm and we all knew the place well." We Allisons asked him whether the house was small as the foundation indicated. "It was a small house," he said. "It might have extended over to the rocks but maybe not. People built small houses in those days. It looked like the house in which the Negroes now live, but faced the road. People didn't seem to need so much room in those days."

He said he remembered well how John Adams, who came from Ireland with John Thompson's father, came to own the Springsteel farm. He (John Adams) got a job (he was always getting one where ever he could) with the widow Springsteel (she was about 60 years of age then, about 75 years ago) who lived on the farm and who owned a great deal of property all around. Within a year and a half he married the widow Springsteel. John Adams proved to be a very good man. He was her second husband. Took good care of the property. "A man by name of Barnes lived then on Mormontown Road where the Conklin place is now. We call all this section now "Waynesville," he said.

There is his signature he made on the paper on which I wrote the data he gave me. He had no glasses and wrote it offhand on his lap as he sat in the car after our trip to the Springsteel farm.

The numbering system used is as follows: The submitter is number 1. The father's number is twice the number of the son or daughter; i.e. double that of the child. Each wife's number is one higher than that of her husband. Even numbers are always male ancestors; odd numbers always female ancestors (except for #1 which is the number assigned to the subject of the table). If all ancestors were known, then all numbers would be used; where ancestors are not known, those numbers are omitted.

If you have brief comments, corrections, or additions to a published ancestor table, or wish to note additional sources, published articles, etc., send them (referencing the Ancestor Table name, date of issue in which published, and the individual person's number in that Ancestor Table) to Bob Protzmann at the address above. He had a son John (minor) named in Ezekiel's will. Average of five census records places Matthew of Pine Meadow ca. 1795. Ezekiel had no children by his second wife Amey Conklin. Matthew's parents and relation to Nicholas Conklin are still not known.

However, please note that Ken Conklin believes Ezekial is the father of Matthew of Pine Meadow. Further research is recommended.
