Nov. 1832, d. 15 Dec. 1897 in West Nyack, buried in Snyders Burial Ground, Valley Cottage. Occupation in 1892 Census listed as Mason. Her mother was Elmira Howlett, b. 8 Sep. 1841 in New City, d. 30 Nov. 1920 on S. Franklin St., S. Nyack, buried in Oak Hill Cem. Her father was Hiram Howlett. The parents of Josephus Hartwick were Samuel Hartwick & Sarah Clark.

I have the following for the 1905 census, 6th. Election Dist., Clarkstown, West Main Street.

I have no other record for William. He died or was divorced by Nov. 1906 when Ella married Louis Phillips. I have not been able to find a marriage record in NY State for Ella and William in 1897/1901, nor a death record for William.

This branch of the Hartwick family goes back at least into the 1790's in Rockland County.

ROCKLAND COUNTY MESSENGER

A weekly newspaper published at Haverstraw, NY A microfilm available at the New City Public Library contains copies of this old newspaper. All issues were not available at filming, some that were had been snipped, and others were in poor condition.

Notices of marriage & death were copied as they were found. The microfilm begins with the Thursday, July 29th, 1847 issue.

July 29, 1847

<u>Married</u>- Mr David Mackey to Miss. Mary Osborn, both of Haverstraw.

<u>Died</u>- Edward Frazer, age 2, son of Fitz-gerald and Mary Frazer, Sunday July 25th.

<u>Died</u>- At NYC, July 22nd, after a long illness, Juliana Hewlett, age 56, mother of Joseph, Henry & Leonard Hewlett. Formerly of Rockland Co. Interred at Cold Springs, Long Island.

Sept. 2nd, 1847

Married- August 15, Mr. Jesse Coe & Miss. Adeline Hutchinson, daughter of William Hutchinson, all of Rockland Lake.

<u>Died-</u> 18 August, Alfred, son of Marquis and Phebe Jane Kirkpatrick, age 11 months, of Haverstraw Village.

<u>Died</u>- 23 August, William, son of Alexander & Selena Milne, age 1 year, of Haverstraw Village.

<u>Died</u>- 30 Aug., Susan Osborn, age 16, of Haverstraw Village.

Obit- Mr. Mordecai Fowler was buried on Saturday last.

Sept. 16th, 1847

Married- Sept. 6th at Newburgh, Mr. Lewis Isaac Jenkinson and Rachel Martin, all of Newburgh.

Died- 8 Sept, in Haverstraw, after a long illness, Mr. Washington Rose, age 25.

Sept. 23nd, 1847

<u>Died</u>- At Rockland Lake on the 16th inst. Antionetta, wife of Rev. G. Hughes of the NJ Conference, and dau. of Dr. E.B. Gains of Morris Co. N.J. Her remains were taken to Montville NJ for interment.

<u>Died</u>- in this village on the 19th inst. Patrick Murray, a native of Ireland, aged 40.

<u>Died</u>- in this village on the 20th inst. Henry Clay, son of John and Eliza Thorne, aged about 1 year.

ROCKLAND COUNTY ARCHIVES

Program Presented at the February 24, 1998 Meeting of the GSRC by the Rockland County Archivist, Mr. Peter Scheibner.

Peter Scheibner spoke about the county archives and the new building for housing them, which is nearing completion in Pomona. The county records are now stored in about forty different locations which makes some of them difficult to access. In addition, they are not stored under optimal conditions. With a lot of support from the State and a very positive county executive, Scott Vanderhoef, and county clerk, Ed Gorman, plans were made to erect a new building to house the county archives.

The new state of the art building will be about 15,800 square feet, a little smaller than originally planned due to expense, and was designed by local architect Jan Degenshein. It will probably be called Building S, directly behind Robert Yeagers old house, in the Pomona Health Complex. There should be parking for about 16 cars. There will be a separate search area, and most likely volunteers will be needed to help in this location. The current staffing is only three people, including himself, and their main business is storing and archiving records. The largest area is the records storage area, which will be filled with shelving. Everything coming in will be bar coded. It is anticipated that the building will be ready about June 1st, 1998.

Mr. Scheibner asked if there were any members of GSRC who would be willing to volunteer to help out at the new archives building. Help will be needed in sorting and cataloguing records. Six members present agreed to give a half day each week to help out. If you have some spare time to contribute, please call. It would be good for members to get involved, both as individuals and as GSRC representatives. Perhaps this will eventually lead to a permanent, accessible location for our own research library. Members can give as little or as much time as they wish. For more information, call:

Although the building is smaller than originally planned, it will be amenable to expansion. There will be a reading room with tables and chairs for looking at census records, etc. and a conference area also. An archives storage room is in the plans for historical material—old books, maps, etc. There will be archival box storage rather than file storage. He anticipates that the hours will be 9 am to 5 pm. Mr Scheibner noted that land deeds will remain at the county clerks office.

The census books will be in the reading room. All other records will be in the archives or storage center. Most of the records will be on microfilm, using the best archival microfilm available, and will be computer indexed. The microfilm is supposed to last over 500 years. He noted that computer media are not archival, lasting perhaps no longer than 3 years, and must be continually backed up. (see attached list of material available to the public)

Mr. Scheibner was very concerned that Rockland County does not have the complete Budke collection. The original documents are all in the New York Public Library, which greatly limits access by Rockland County residents. He has made some overtures to the New York Library for microfilming these records, without success, and asked if our society would have any suggestions in this regard. He noted that we should pool our efforts to microfilm the entire collection so it is available here in Rockland County.
