ONANDAGA COUNTY FAMILIES

While researching for my book, "Crum Cousins", I found that Alexander Crum Sr. left Rockland Co. in the early 1800s and with his wife Charity Jones had settled and raised his family of seven children in Onandaga Co. NY. I also found that several other families from the Haverstraw and Ramapo area left Rockland and relocated in Onandaga Co., and to other areas of western New York State. I decided I had to know why this group left Rockland and how they found their way to Onandaga County.

The "why", I learned, was because of cheap land. In 1782 the State of New York set aside one and a half million acres of land that had belonged to the Onandaga and Cayuga Indian tribes. The land was surveyed and divided into lots for the Bounty Land Grants of Revolutionary War Veterans. (And later for veterans of the war of 1812). The land was

divided into 28 townships of 60,000 acres each, and each township further divided into 600 acre farm lots. The great majority of the veterans Bounty Land Grants were not settled by the veterans themselves, but were sold for a few dollars to land speculators, who in turn sold the land to the settlers and farmers. Originally the entire Land Grant area was called Onandaga County, but as population increased, various parts were set apart as new counties. All of present day Cortland, Cayuga, Seneca, and Onandaga Counties, as well as parts of Tompkins, Wayne, Schuyler and Oswego Counties were in the Land Grant area.

Of how these Rocklanders traveled to Onandaga County

I can't say for certain, but they surely must have taken some advantage of boat travel on the Hudson and Mohawk Rivers. When the Erie Canal was opened in 1825, it made traveling back and forth to visit and conduct business affairs much easier. The canal opened the interior portions of New York State, and towns sprang up along its 350 mile length. While only four feet deep and forty feet wide, it none the less made travel by boat and barge possible, non stop from New York City to Buffalo. The Erie also made for much faster and cheaper transportation of farm and lumber products to the eastern markets, and opened the way for settlement west

toward Ohio and beyond. One of the regular stops along the canal was at Baldwinsville, and that's where many of the Rockland County transplants stopped and made their home.


Many of the families that migrated to Onandaga County were related by blood and/or marriage. Alexander Crum and his wife Charity Jones, and her father John Jones and wife Sally, made the trip. Included as well was Charity's brother, William Jones and his wife Sarah, and later her brother Benjamin Jones and his wife Rachel. Samuel Howe of Otsego County, NY married an Orange Co. woman, Catherine Cunningham, and settled in VanBuren, Onandaga County. Their daughter Mary Ann married Alexander Crum Jr., and daughter Catherine married Edwin Jones. William Crum, brother of Alexander, traveled back to Rockland for a wife, marrying Catherine Garrison of Haverstraw. Maryetta Jones, daughter of William Jones, married David Voorhees (of Rockland ??) and Williams son John Jones married his cousin Catherine, daughter of

Benjamin Jones. The Earll family also traveled west to Onandaga and a son married into the Crum family. There were surely many more names that haven't been found yet.

Riverside Cemetery in
Baldwinsville NY was the last
resting place for many of the
Rockland transplants. Some
from the second generation,
and no doubt more from the
next generation headed west
along the canal to the open
farm lands of Ohio and
beyond.

Doing each families genealogy is a complex and convoluted job. If any reader has a missing link in any of these families around the early part of the 1800s, a search of the census reports for the towns of

Baldwinsville, Sorrell Hill, Warners, Pompey, VanBuren, or Skaneateles may prove helpful.



JONES FAMILY

It is very probable that the Joseph Jones who settled in the Clarkstown area was a brother of John Jones. (Jacob Jones, son of Joseph, married his cousin at her fathers house in Haverstraw in 1776. Both were only sixteen years old.) John Jones was married to Sarah/Sallie Smith, sister of Rebecca Smith, who married Lucas DeGraw.

EAGLE SCOUTS EFFORTS

Young Mr. Erik Damtoft of New City, NY, in preparation to earn his Eagle Scout rank, has refurbished and provided access to a remote area of the Germonds Cemetery property, in Bardonia. Referred to as the Brower Family Plot in Krell's "That All May Be Remembered", the site contains nine graves dating from 1801 to 1860, and include at least two Revolutionary War veterans.

The Brower Plot was a considerable distance from the Germonds Cemetery proper, and had been blocked from view and access by woods and undergrowth and years of fallen leaves and other debris. Erik constructed a 350 foot long path, lined with wood chips, from the public cemetery to the ancient gravesite. The site was then cleared of brush and downed, diseased and excess trees. Missing stones were located within the area and returned to their proper place. Broken stones were placed within wooden frames placed horizontally on the ground.

Erik has documented his research of those buried in the plot, and presented it to be added to the Germonds Cemetery records. Work was begun in March 1998 and completed in October. Boy Scout Troop 41 conducted Opening Ceremonies at the Cemetery on Sunday, October 25th., which included a Tribute to Volunteers, Presentation of the Colors, Procession to the Grave Site, Plaque unveiling, and a Salute to veterans performed by the Re-Enactment Group, Second Regiment, Orange County Militia.

Erik hopes to place a complete record of his project, including photographs, in the New City Library, Rockland Room.

Editors Note: Erik Damtoft exemplifies the dedication to principle and the adherence to Duty and Honor embraced by Scouts everwhere.

RECENT PROGRAMS

Cemetery and Tombstone Restoration

At a recent meeting Mr. Roger King of Monroe, Orange County, spoke about cemeteries, and in particular about tombstone repair and preservation. A full time teacher, Mr. King also conducts a business involving finding, repairing and restoring lost and damaged tombstones. A lifelong interest in the subject has taught Roger many shortcuts, and he has developed many unique techniques for completing his work. Some modern day devices, such as GPS (Global Positioning System) and Ground Penetrating Radar are also used.

Roger noted that many of the very old cemeteries were located on sand hills where the digging would be easier, particularly in winter. Native sandstone was used to mark grave sites, and that has often deteriorated over time. Limestone was also used later, and that is eroding quickly in the acid rain. When a professional stone carver was used, he often marked his work by cutting in a symbol or his initials, beneath ground level. The best way to clean a dirty or moss encrusted stone is with a soft brush and straight bottled lemon juice. (citric acid) The lemon juice will kill the moss and lichen, but will absolutely not harm the stone. The juice should be allowed to work for several minutes, and then flushed away with clear water. Repeat the process until the stone is free of moss. If a stone is particularly difficult to read, spray shave cream on it and after spreading it evenly, wipe away the excess with a rubber squeegee leaving the residue in the stone engravings. With a little effort, even the most difficult stone can sometimes be deciphered. Rubbings made with paper and charcoal, etc. are not recommended, as the rubbing will sometimes damage delicate carvings. Photographs are always advisable, and they will sometimes show more detail than revealed to the naked eve. Light from an angle is often better that straight on light.. Wash away all shave cream and lemon juice, and clean up the site when finished.

As an aside, on an unrelated subject, Roger told us that years ago a local attorney had taken many rolls of film, photographing the residents and mountain people of the Ramapo's. The film was never developed, the photographer passed away, and the film somehow made it's way to a southern state. With help from GSRC member Miral Haubner the film was located and is being developed. About ninety photos have been developed so far. Roger had three pictures with him and showed them around. They were of Maggie Gannon, Gil Pitt, and others.

A lively question and answer session followed Roger King's most interesting talk.

ORANGETOWN HISTORICAL MUSEUM

Our November meeting was held Tuesday evening November 24th, at the Orangetown Historical Museum and Archives, 213 Blue Hill Rd, Pearl River, and was hosted by the Orangetown Town Historian, Mrs. Mary R. Cardenas. After a short business meeting, Mary spoke to us about the work involved in preparing the museum for visitors and displaying various aspects of the museum's holdings, together with items loaned from private individuals. Mary also explained what the museum has in the way of genealogical material, which includes a number of family genealogies, quite a few periodicals, newspapers, and other items. All were invited to go in the library room and check it out. We also spent some time viewing the current museum display, a collection of photographs and other memorabilia connected with local area trains, train Station, bridges, etc.

Refreshments were served, and everyone enjoyed our museum visit.
