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**Minutes of Meeting of
Genealogical Society of Rockland County**

Tuesday, January 24, 2006 - New City Library

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by Treasurer Robert Protzmann, in the absence of our President and Vice President.

Treasurer's Report: Bob Protzmann reported a balance in the checkbook, as of December 31, 2005, of \$11,824.48.

Membership: Bob reported 190 paid members to date; 26 remain unpaid.

Indexing: Les Baisley stated that the Shankey records are being proofread. Wyman-Mock Funeral Home records are almost finished; the cover has to be done. The White Funeral Home records are still being proofread, and we have discovered that some are missing. This will be followed up. Ramapo, Stony Point, and Orangetown cemeteries are in progress.

Web site: Karen Lamberton stated that the updating of driving directions to the cemeteries listed on the web site is continuing. The 1892 census is ready to go up. Brian Belanger's original signature project is also ready to be put up. Karen noted that we are looking for any pictures, memories, stories, etc., to be put on the web site in the Rockland Scrapbook. Sally Pellegrini suggested that we try for some funding from the County Legislature.

Announcements:

The libraries in Rockland County are starting a project of scanning/digitizing all their postcards. New City's have been finished and will be placed on line.

On Saturday, January 14, 2006, an afternoon mini-conference for beginners in genealogy was held at the New City Library. There were six tables with approximately two GSRC members at each table handling one genealogical subject area, i.e., vital records, census, general questions, etc. We didn't have a lot of people, but members felt that the ones who did come were given good advice and information to research their families. It was felt that this same thing would be worthwhile doing at one or two of our regular monthly meetings during the year.

Sally noted that Peter H. Judd has donated a copy of his genealogy on the Haring and Judd families to the Library.

She also noted that the Library now subscribes to the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS) databases.

Sally announced a project (through Nita Lowey's office) to obtain oral histories from veterans. She will participate, and, if anyone wishes to help, he/she should see her for details.

Megan Smolenyak Smolenyak will be at the Library on Saturday, May 6th, to speak on using DNA in genealogical research.

On April 11th, a bus trip is planned to Fraunces Tavern, the Customs Bldg, etc., in New York City.

Bob mentioned Nancy Canfield's new book about St. Agatha's Home, and asked for information on any other children's homes, orphanages, etc., in Rockland County.

On February 4th, Orange County Genealogical Society is going to have a program summarizing the Federation of Genealogical Society's fall conference in Salt Lake City.

Also on February 4th, Carl Nordstrom will speak about his new book at the Nyack Library.

Montgomery Maze Files: Marie Koestler stated

that the Historical Society has given us some old records of Montgomery Maze from when he was recording and transcribing cemeteries. Much of it is in bad shape (mildewed, etc.), but there are some copies of unrecorded deeds.

Program: The program for tonight (Peter Cutal, "History of Cutting Ice in Rockland Lake") was canceled, due to the speaker's illness.

Visitors introduced themselves and gave their names of interest (Jansky, Havlik, Zelenka-Rockland Lake).

Jack Cullen showed a map of Haverstraw and Haverstraw Bay, including Centenary, he purchased from the Haverstraw Brick Museum. He was interested in having it, since his grandfather's home is on the map.

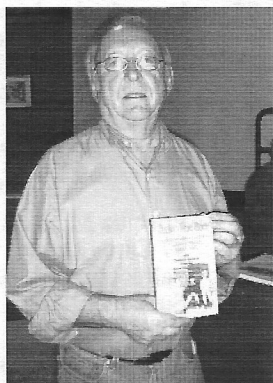
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The Orphan Trains
presented by Tom Riley

Program Presented at the February 28, 2006, Meeting of
The Genealogical Society of Rockland County

Maryann Smith introduced Tom Riley, author of several books, including "Orphan Train Riders," a brief history of the Orphan Train era (1854-1929). Tom noted that \$4 of the \$24 cost is donated to the Orphan Train Museum in Albion, NY.

Tom spent his childhood years from age 7 through high school (graduated from Spring Valley High School) at Happy Valley in Pomona, with his three brothers and sister. He noted that Rockland County had quite a few schools or homes for underprivileged or orphaned inner-city children. Happy Valley consisted of 311 acres, which was self-sustaining; when the children came of age, they helped work the farm and also learned a trade. Following graduation from high school, Tom joined the Air Force, was stationed in the Philippines during the Vietnam War as a photographer in aerial reconnaissance, and later attended college under the GI Bill. About thirty years after he had left Happy Valley, he received a call from Haya Khoury, a Happy Valley alumni, who was now a corporate lawyer, regarding getting a reunion together before Happy Valley was turned into a municipal golf course. On July 19, 1992, the reunion was held on the old grounds in Pomona.



Tom became interested in the history of Happy Valley and how it got started, and published a book about it, "Happy Valley: A History and Remembrance." While researching the book, he discovered that the records of the Orphan Train riders from 1832 through 1929 had been stored at Happy Valley. They were later transferred to the Historical Society of Rockland County, and most were then sent on to the Orphan Train Society in Arkansas, where they are being catalogued, indexed, and computerized. He was able to look through all the boxes in the barn at the Historical Society and realized that there was a wealth of information contained in them, as well as a story that was not well known. These records included surrender and entrance books, and many magazines published from 1832-1963 by the American Female Guardian Society--"Advocate for Moral Reform."

The Society was formed in 1832 by a group of women, who were involved in temperance societies, because they were appalled at the conditions in which the 10 to 15,000 homeless or destitute children in New York City were living. Many of these children were on the streets due to alcoholism in the family. At this time, there were no social services at all to take care of the children, who were referred to as "Street Arabs." The women started industrial schools to teach the children a trade and give them an education.

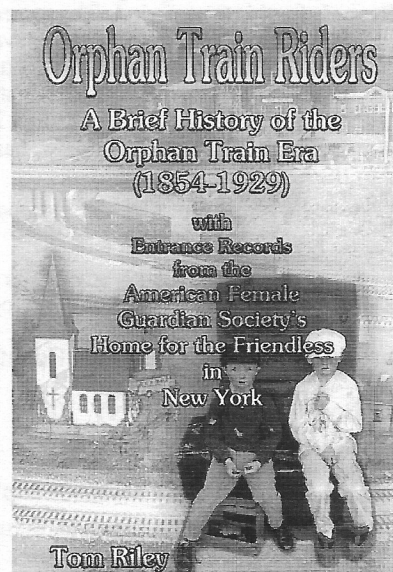
Charles Loring Brace, a Connecticut minister, came up

with the idea of sending the children to a family who would adopt them. They would be loaded onto a train, stop at a station, families would choose a child, and the train would go on to the next station. These "Orphan Trains" served all 48 states. Those children who were left on the train at the end of the line would then ride the train back to New York City, and go out again on the next Orphan Train. These trains operated for 75 years. The estimate now is that 400,000 to 600,000 children rode the Orphan Trains, with about 33,000 placed in New York State alone. Tom noted that approximately 75 to 80% of the total turned out well.

After Tom had written his book on the Orphan Trains, he was invited to Buffalo for a two-hour train ride and re-enactment of the Orphan Train experience. There were over 500 people in attendance. He showed us a videotape of the re-enactment, which included interviews with orphans who had ridden the trains. Today, there are about 200 living Orphan Train riders.

He noted that the main ethnic groups represented were English, Irish, and German, and, after the Civil War, Italians and Jews. It was interesting to note that there were no black riders on the Orphan Trains since the Black community "boarded their own."

1911 Canadian Census On-line

Steve Morse put up a one-step search form for the 1911 Canadian census online at:

<http://stevemorse.org/census/canada1911.html>

Steve's search form allows searches by person or geographic region.

For a search by person, the fields are first name is exactly or starts with; middle initial, last name is exactly, sounds like, starts with or best matches; year of birth between ____ and ____; birth month; age; birthplace; sex; marital status; relationship; tribal; and year of immigration.

For a search by geographic region, the fields are province; district; sub-district; sub-district name; and street address. When a province is selected, the district drop-down list consists of only those districts in that province. The district names and numbers are in drop-down boxes rather than in text fields. A district can be selected rather than typed in, avoiding the possibility of making a spelling error. When a district is selected, the sub-district drop-down list consists of only those sub-districts in that district. When a sub-district number is selected, a description of that sub-district is shown so the person searching is sure it is the one intended.

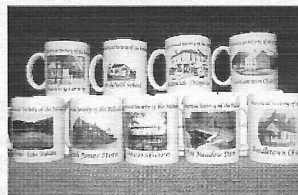
