President's Corner**

Introduction

At the June meeting of the Genealogy Society of Rockland County, the gavel was officially handed over to me. As I am a relative newcomer to the organization, I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Barbara de Mare, I have two grown children and four grandchildren, and live in Bergen County, New Jersey. By profession I am a New York and New Jersey attorney practicing primarily in the fields of estate planning, estate administration, and corporate law. When not practicing law, traveling or doing things with my four wonderful grandchildren, I am generally involved in genealogical pursuits. Most evenings I spend at least a couple of hours at my computer in my genealogy room. Many of my travels involve genealogical research, and I am teaching my grandchildren the joys of genealogy. All four now love cemetery visits, and get very excited if they find a tombstone for which we are searching.

Since joining the Genealogy Society of Rockland County a year ago, I have been very impressed with the high level of research undertaken by Society members, and their dedication to preserving our heritage for future generations. The time and effort put into the publications printed by the Society is overwhelming. These publications are exceptionally well written and proof-read, and hence can be relied upon for containing accurate information. Although I belong to many genealogical societies, I am most impressed with the work accomplished by this one and hence have chosen to be most involved with it. I am honored to have been elected president of this august group.

It is my goal during my presidency to write a column for each addition of the newsletter discussing research techniques, a particular area of research, interesting Rockland findings, or whatever else strikes my fancy when I sit down to write. I am well aware that many of you are better researchers than I, but I have found that with genealogy there is no such thing as too many hints or too much information. I hope you find this column enjoyable regardless of your level of research ability.

As the second annual Phillips/Knapp Family Association reunion is being announced in this issue, I have decided to talk about my initial Rockland research. My Rockland ancestry derives from my paternal grandmother, Ethel (Dykeman) Ferry. She was a member of the DAR through a Rockland ancestor, Ebenezer McKenzie. Ebenezer's granddaughter Catherine married Thomas Phillips, a grandson of the Revolutionary War militiaman Eli Phillips and one of the three Phillips brothers who settled in Rockland County.

A Family Fable

Although it is generally acknowledged that stories about three brothers are usually apocryphal, there is good documentary evidence that the three Phillips brothers of Rockland County actually existed. That is not to say that many mythical stories of their existence have not built up over the years, but the fact of their existence is genuine.

I first became entranced with the Phillips brothers as a child when reading entries inserted into the DAR application of my grandmother Ferry. According to one of these inserts, brothers Eli and Gilbert together with nephew Daniel purchased land in Stony Point, New York in 1774. The entire insert reads:

"The Phillips farm, lying back of the village of Thiells, Rockland Co., was purchased in the year 1774 by Eli Phillips, Gilbert Phillips, and Daniel Phillips, Jr., the latter being a nephew of the first two named. Gilbert and Daniel went away after a time, no record is known where, leaving the farm in the possession of Eli. This property later belonged to James E. Phillips,

brother of Eli, and father of Thomas Phillips. The property was sold October 1920, to Clarence June, by the surviving heirs."

For some reason the phraseology "Gilbert and Daniel went away" always captured my imagination. I resolved that some day I would begin a quest to get the whole story. That day occurred in April 2005 when I finally joined the Genealogical Society of Rockland County (GSRC). I had spent some odd moments here and there looking at census results, and perusing histories of the area, but had made no serious efforts to find them. About all that I had learned was that James E. Phillips, rather than being the brother of Eli, was his son.

Right after joining the GSRC, I was advised that there was going to be a Phillips/Knapp reunion in September 2005. I had no idea who Knapp was, but had every intention of attending the function and finding out. The reunion occurred on a beautiful September weekend in 2006 on the shores of the Hudson River. The first thing I noticed was that my sister and I were the only Eli Phillips descendants attending the reunion. There was one possible Gilbert descendant present. The rest of the Phillips brothers progeny were all descended from Daniel, and most of those still lived in Rockland County. So much for Daniel "going away." Further, I learned that the Daniel who purchased the farm could not have been nephew Daniel, as he was not born until 1775. Daniel the purchaser was more likely brother Daniel, who died 13 Dec 1796.

One of the first people I met upon becoming involved with the GSRC was Joan Brooks. I think she has the entire genealogy of Rockland County in her head! Although she is not herself a Phillips-Knapp descendant, her husband Barry Brooks is. She and Barry have befriended and interviewed Bob Phillips, the oldest living Phillips-Knapp descendant in the area and a source of tremendous information. He has many old papers which were in the Phillips barn when he cleaned it out for sale. I had the privilege of talking with Bob Phillips and seeing his documents last Sunday. Joan had graciously given me duplicates of her copies when I first met her.

In addition to everything else she does for the County of Rockland, Joan volunteers in the archives two days a week. I asked her if she could get me a copy of the 1774 deed to the Phillips Brothers. She did not find that deed, but did find an 1806 deed pursuant to which Eli and Gilbert sold their shares of the "Phillips Farm" to their nephew Daniel Phillips. This is where the confusion in my grandmother's notes probably arose. The 1806 deed recites that the property being conveyed is 49 acres, a part of lot #13 in the Cheesecocks Patent. According to Cole's History of Rockland County, this lot was the worst in the Patent.

Each partial answer to a query just leads to more questions. The land where my great-great-grandparents Thomas and Catherine (McKenzie) Phillips lived was described in 1914 pictures as the "Phillips Farm." Thomas was the son of James and grandson of Eli. According to the recorded deed found by Joan Brooks, Daniel, Jr., had bought the Phillips Farm in 1806. Is the home of Thomas and Catherine Phillips the same Phillips Farm as described in the 1806 deed, or is it another one? If it is the same, how did it revert to brother Eli and/or his heirs? If it is not, from whence came the second farm and where is it located in relation to the first?

Moral

Take all family stories, even written ones, with several grains of salt. Although most stories begin with some truth, they generally get confused in the retelling, and even the writing, and require careful researching to separate the truth from the fiction.
