FINDING NEW YORK VITAL RECORDS

Excerpted from: The New York Researcher, Fall 2011

NYS did not require local governments to keep vital records until 1880 – check local town halls or religious institutions. Check the following repositories for your area of interest: Deaths and marriages 1881-1961; births: 1880-1936.

New York State Archives, Albany, Albany County Broome County Public Library, Binghamton, Broome County Buffalo & Erie County Public Library, Buffalo, Erie County Steele Memorial Library, Elmira, Chemung County Crandall Public Library, Glens Falls, Warren County National Archives, Northeast Region, Manhattan, NY County Patchogue-Medford Library, Patchogue, Suffolk County Rochester Public Library, Rochester, Monroe, County Onondaga County Public Library, Syracuse, Onondago County Flower Memorial Library, Watertown, Jefferson County

Once you have found a record, you can apply for a hard copy of the record, go to: www.health.state.ny.us and follow the instructions.

Records for NYC, the former city of Brooklyn (now part of Kings County) are held at the NY Municipal Archives, 31 Chambers Street, Manhattan. Check online: www.nyc.gov/html/records

Prior to 1898, the boroughs of Richmond (Staten Island) and Queens, and parts of the Bronx, were not part of NYC. Records for the remaining boroughs for 1881-1897 may be found through the NYS Dept. of Health, and for 1898 forward at the Municipal Archives.

Arkansas Sheriff's census 1823 (Arkansas County) and 1829 (for 11 counties) 1865 for Washington County; 1911 census of Confederate veterans (44 counties)

“Researching Your Ancesters in Kleindeutschland – Little Germany”

During the 19th century, German immigration rapidly increased. Immigrants tended to establish settlements in urban areas. The largest settlement in New York City was the “Kleindeutschland” -- “Little Germany.” Reasons for this increase were due to the economy in Germany and to the earlier Napoleonic Wars. The majority of people came from Baden, Württemberg and the Prussian territory along the Rhine. The decline in economy was a result of the potato rot.

“Little Germany” was the area on the Lower East Side with 14th Street on the north, Grand Street on the South, Broadway on the west and the East River on the east (the 17th, 13th, 11th and 10th wards). This was Mid-Town Manhattan. The 17th Ward was the last to be settled by the Germans. Between 1855 and 1880 the only cities with a larger German population were Vienna and Berlin; by 1910, only Berlin surpassed New York City.

Germans from the Prussian territories tended to travel to the western regions of the United States. Of those who remained in the New York City area, many were artisans, craftsmen and skilled workers. Others followed the trades of brewers, furriers, tailors, shoemakers and furniture makers. For example, Henry Steinway and his family came to New York in 1850 and started the Steinway & Sons Piano Company.

There were German language theaters, libraries and newspapers, and churches. The Swamp Church merged with St. Matthew Lutheran Church in 1831. Germans from the Baden area tended to be Roman Catholic; their church, St. Nicholas, built in 1833, was demolished in 1939. There was a substantial German-Jewish population in the area; the first synagogue was built in 1828 on Norfolk Street.

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St. Marks Evangelical Lutheran Church, Long Island, planned a German cruise on the East River on the *General Slocum*, in June of 1904. When fire broke out, most of the 1300 people perished. This tragedy may have been the final blow in hastening the end of Little Germany. With the advent of World War I, anti-German sentiment hastened the end of Kleindeutschland.

Available research sources for this area of “Little Germany,” include Census records for 1850 and up which list all names in the household. The 1845 census, only listed head of household and number of male and females, many were born in Germany. The 1900 census notes whether an immigrant was naturalized, and the date.

Check City Directories: alphabetical name, special lists under addresses, telephone numbers, and occupations. Vital Records: Birth, Marriage and Deaths from 1866 for the New York City counties are located at the Municipal Archives on Chambers Street.

Mr. Leiby presented a very interesting program with many sidelights concerning the Germans who lived, and worked in this area of New York City.

“The role of the Historian in local history and his or her connection with a genealogical society”

Speaker: Craig Long, Rockland County Historian

In 1917, a bill was passed that every county, village and township was to have a historian, it was known as the “Historian’s Law,” a part of the “State Education Law.” The duties of the historian were to include responding to requests for information on the history of the locality. They could collect and organize local history material, cooperate with other public officials in the preservation of historically valuable local records. The records that they collect were to be stored in vaults for safe-keeping. Upon retirement, the records were to be turned over to the county. The most recent outline of the responsibilities was in 1990 – four categories: research, writing, publication, and historic preservation. Note that the collecting and dispensing of genealogical information is not included in the duties.

When a historian receives a request for genealogical inquiry, they may refer it to a genealogical society member, the county archives, or any person knowledgeable in that field.

Early historical records for the Town of Ramapo do not exist. They may not have been turned over to a new historian, to the county, stolen, or otherwise lost. Clarkstown is fortunate to have records from c. 1798. Today, it is possible to find surviving historical records on the internet, i.e. on E-Bay. These records would have to be purchased. Unfortunately, the Historian does not have funds to pay for this type of record.

The duty of the historian is to awaken and foster the interest of the community members in local history through participating in the preservation of historic buildings or areas; working with historical societies and other service organizations by taking part in projects like the placing of historical markers, attending and speaking at parades and pageants to call attention to the local history event.

Every family can encourage historical interest in their own young by talking about past and present history events, taking part in local celebrations and encouraging them to be aware of the past and how things were made, to learn about things that the older generations take for granted.

In his fourth grade history class presentations, Mr. Long, like a magician, brings out a couple boxes filled with items that are not in common usage today. These items help to awaken the interest of the children to the way life was in the past. Simple things that fourth graders, and others, may not know about or to even have seen: for example - a glass bottle for milk that was delivered to the home and placed on the doorstep in a galvanized metal box to keep it from freezing in the winter or spoiling in the heat of summer; the use of a simple doorbell, an old rotary dial telephone; wooden toys; a flat iron that had to be heated on a wood-burning stove rather than using a steam iron or even just wash-and-wear clothing. There was the fountain pen and ink and before that the quill pen; old-fashioned flashlights with bulbs and lenses. He told of finding arrow heads near his childhood home, and the stone head that the Indians tied to a forked branch to use as a hammer. The majority of today’s children may not know what a record player is or a 45 rpm record. It is important for parents to share these old memories and oral histories with their children. That is an important role for the historian, the genealogist and parents.

Dick Eastman’s newsletter reports a new numbering system that has been published.

Ancestral_figure_01 Genealogists have invented several different numbering systems over the years to keep track of the individuals in a genealogy. In situations where names are repeated often in a family, a numbering system helps identify the individual of interest. We already have Ahnentafel Numbers, d’Aboville Numbers, Henry Numbers, the Register System, the Dollarhide System. And the NGSQ System. Each assigns numbers, letters, or combinations of numbers and letters to each individual. Now, writing in the American Ancestors web site, Capers W McDonald has suggested using a new numbering system: the Ancestral Lines Pairing System.

Quoting from the web site:

A new ancestral numbering system has been developed that visibly displays component lines and generations of pedigrees in either text or chart formats. This “Ancestral Lines Pairing System” meets essential requirements of being easy to read and understand while maintaining the integrity of its unique indicators, and recording relationships briefly with as much useful information as possible.
